After discussion with the St Helens Police Inspector, it was agreed that Council would not implement "No Go' zones for wheeled recreational devices at this stage. The issue will be reassessed during February after the trial period.

### **Binalong Bay Footpath**


Works are proceeding on installing approximately 300 metres of concrete footpath south of King Street.

The purpose of the funding is to assist voluntary organisations to purchase equipment specifically to help volunteers in their work for the community to a maximum amount of \$5,000.


"This extra funding is in recognition of the outstanding work done by volunteers in the community" Senator Watson said.

# Information update on the Break O'Day Health Resource Association Inc.

Our Association was formed at a meeting to discuss the lack of doctors and other health services in our area.

Our Constitution allows only one health professional to every four community members and we have members from Fingal, St Marys, Scamander and St Helens who are meeting bi-monthly at either St Marys or St Helens.

Last month the Break O'Day Health Resource Association signed a contract with the Commonwealth Department of Health and Aged Care to provide additional health services to Break O'Day.

### These include:

- 1. "Healthy Communities" coordinator.
- 2. Proactive Social Worker (that is not taking on individual clients except on an emergency basis) who will be working on programs to better the health of our community.
- 3. Dietician to improve the dietary considerations of our aged and disadvantaged.
- 4. Increased Podiatry services to both St Marys and St Helens.
- 5. Increase Palliative care for those in our community who have lost someone close to them.

We are now in the process of formulating a contract with the State Department of Health & Human Services through Aged, Rural and Community Health to provide the health professionals to provide these services.

We also have to provide premises and ancillary services for these people and are securing the lease of the old hospital/playcentre in Circassian Street, St Helens that belongs to Medea Park. It is in a state of disrepair but is very suited to our needs. Much has to be done to bring it up to standard and we are holding a working bee of interested community members to cleanup the inside on Sunday September 9th at 10am. Everyone welcome!

We are also applying for a grant under "Accommodation Project for Medical students and Registrars in Rural and Remote Areas" to purchase a property to provide accommodation for these people similarly to that provided at St Marys.

Our President, Julie Severin, is shortly attending a National Community Leaders workshop in Canberra and Sophie Legge is attending the Stronger Families and Communities Strategy meetings.

I have great pleasure in presenting the report for the past year and in the absence of our President, Mr Bob Yates, I take the opportunity to record this committees appreciation of his work as President for Meals on Wheels since 1981 – twenty years! He has also been very much involved as a member of the executive committee of Meals on Wheels Tasmania, spending much time in travelling to meetings in other parts of the State in pursuit of this duty.

We also acknowledge the long time membership of Mrs Una Camplin who has had to retire this year on account of ill health. She has been a very valuable member and always reliable to come up with advice and help on special occasions.

This year the number of meals has declined to 3352 compared with 3777 last year, as several recipients have passed away or have joined a nursing home.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT NEET INC.-ST MARYS

- Q. What is NEET?
- A. NEET Centre Inc., the full title, stands for North East Education and Training Centre Incorporated. St Marys NEET is one campus in a cluster including Winnaleah NEET, St Helens NEET and Flinders Island NEET campuses.
- Q. Where is the NEET Centre at St Marys?
- A. The NEET skills centre is situated at the rear of the Memorial Hall in St Marys. (Students also access facilities and staff at the School campus on some days, for some subjects).
- Q. Who can attend NEET?
- A. Anyone who is interested in pursuing a learning pathway after leaving school. This could mean anyone of any age who wishes to return to study TCE (Tasmanian Certificate of Education) subjects or a Vocational Education & Training (VET) course.
- Q. Why would anyone want to return to study or continue study at NEET?
- If you choose to take on further study after leaving compulsory education, you may find more options open to you, which could be a pathway towards a future occupation or study at another institution such as TAFE or a university.
- You would not need to move to the city to pursue further study, as all the courses we offer are the same as those available at the
  colleges/TAFE in the cities.
- All the VET courses are nationally recognized and totally portable, which means continuation of the courses is possible if you move to another part of Australia after beginning the course at NEET. Also, some courses are being offered on-line with minimal face-to-face contact required between students and staff.


