




#### Australian tour 2002

Looking for something Delicious and Decadent? Here is a Slice of Heaven for you! Caribbean Chocolate Rum Cake MMMM !!!!!

#### Cake mixture

225g (8 oz) softened butter 12 medium eggs, separated 25g (1 oz) cocoa powder 175g (6 oz) good quality cooking chocolate, melted

300g (10 oz) castor sugar 175g (6 oz) plain flour 50g (2 oz) ground almonds



For the filling

500 ml (18 fl oz) double cream 2 tablespoons dark rum 300 (10 oz) Good quality plain dark chocolate - chopped

Preparation time 20 minutes plus time for cake to cool and icing to set. Cook in 23 cm (9") round spring clip tin, buttered and floured.

- 1.Preheat the oven to 180° (160° fan forced or 350° F)
- 2. Beat the softened butter with half the sugar till pale and light. Gradually beat in the egg yolks and fold in the flour, cocoa powder and ground almonds alternately with the melted chocolate. Whisk the egg whites until stiff, then gradually whisk in the remaining sugar. Fold the egg whites into the cake mixture and pour into the tin.
- 3. Bake for 1 hour 10 minutes or until well risen and springy to touch. Leave to cool in tin for 5 minutes, then turn out on wire rack to finish cooling.
- 4. To make the filling and icing, heat the cream until boiling, remove the pan from the heat and whisk in the chopped chocolate and rum until smooth and glossy. Leave to cool until the mixture has thickened.
- 5. Cut cake into 3 layers horizontally and use some of the chocolate mixture to sandwich the cake together. Spread the remainder on the top and sides of the cake

#### Young people, liquor and licences

A problem which has become apparent, particularly over the past couple of weeks is the sale of liquor to young

people. It is enough of a problem that young people are drinking liquor on regular occasions, especially in the street. The hotel that sells liquor to a young person receives a certain number of warnings for doing so. Once that number is reached, the hotels liquor licence is suspended for a period of time and the hotel may receive a fine. However, this is not the issue. An adult who purchases liquor and supplies to a young person is an offence. The adult will end up with a court appearance for supplying, and the youth is also liable for prosecution. The Liquor and Accommodation Act covers most offences involving liquor.

Young people get a second mention!

I once again have to comment on the driving behaviour of the young people of the town. It is fair for them to have a chance, but it seems that many of them have taken the chance to mean they can get away with anything. As a result of this behaviour, a zero tolerance will have to be taken against these drivers. This means that traffic infringements will be issued for minor offences, which may normally be dealt with by way of a caution. This tolerance level will continue until such time as the offences and behaviour cease or until the responsible drivers licences are disqualified.

If any person wishes to assist with this campaign, feel free to take note of the offences being committed and be prepared to make a written statement so that the drivers can be proceeded against. Any assistance would be greatly appreciated.






We are now into our third week of trading and the results so far are very pleasing.






