The long weekend as per last year was relatively quiet. The busiest times was when the traffic was passing through. As far as this

goes. no vehicles were detected excessively speeding through St Marys during the times that the radar gun happened to be active. Unfortunately a number of tourists that happened to be travelling through Scamander may have thought that the speed limit was somewhat higher than the posted KMH limit. in this area were detected between 75 and 85kmh. Constable Bonner at Fingal also reports that there were a number of tourists and locals alike that fell into the grasps of his book as a result of that little black radar that is attached to the side of his vehicle. A positive side to the story is that there were no reported motor vehicle accidents for the weekend.

As quiet as St Marys may have been over the weekend there is always something going on. It just so happens that an upcoming scientist was experimenting with rocks and glass. The result of the discovery, that a rock is very capable of penetrating glass which is constructed into a frame, and commonly known as a window. In fact, there were six experiments conducted at the school, most likely occurring on Sunday evening. The upcoming scientists did not have permission to conduct the experiments and have now caused an inconvenience to the school both in repairing the windows and the monetary side of things. There are a number of juvenile suspects to these acts, and any other information about who was wandering the school over the weekend, will be appreciated.

This poses a problem in respect of being a member down and not getting the coverage that we need. Negotiations are in place with the St Helens inspector in order to have a relieving officer until such time as the position is filled. I will keep you up to date with this issue.

State Emergency Service St Marys Sub-Unit Proposal


The State Emergency Service Break O'Day unit is based at St Helens and provides the Break O'Day municipality with Road Accident Rescue, Vertical Rescue, Storm Damage and Search and Rescue services. Due to the large area needed to be covered, several members have suggested that a subunit at St Marys would improve response times.

A meeting earlier in the year was held to discuss the proposal of setting up a sub-unit based at St Marys. This unit would be under the St Helens unit and would provide first response to the St Marys area and back-up response for the St Helens area.

Another meeting was held in October to discuss fundraising and details for setting up this sub-unit. It would cost approximately \$25000 to set up a sub-unit with minimal rescue equipment. We are in the process of looking for local sponsorship. We currently have 12 people interested in joining.

This is a much need community service, so please get behind it and give us your support.
