

# Grade 4/5 St Marys District High School Students Win Silver

On Friday 8th of November, six students from the Grade 4/5 class travelled to Hobart to represent their class team at the official award presentation ceremony for the winners of the 2002 State-wide Crime Stoppers Youth Challenge.

During Term II, students had been working with their teachers, Mrs Miller and Miss Halton on the topic of Shoplifting. They surveyed students, compiled and analysed graphs of their findings and developed a list of recommendations for the police, retailers and community to reduce shoplifting. They gained significant insight into the nature of the crime and its extent in our community through interviews with Constable Luke Rockliffe and Miss Ros Smith.

As a result of their efforts, the class gained the Silver (2<sup>nd</sup>) award for the Upper Primary category. The winners in this section were St. Peter Channel Convent School. Over 110



classes had entered the competition and the audience at the ceremony held at the Hotel Grand Chancellor numbered over 300. The students were presented with their framed certificate (acknowledging "their contribution to the wellbeing of our community") on stage by the Chairman of Crime Stoppers, the Minister for Police and Public Safety, the Commissioner for Police and the Minister for Education. also received a cheque for \$200.

### KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOUR

Among the foreign birds introduced into Tasmania in colonial times there was the goldfinch, sometimes called the "thistle finch" because of its particular liking for thistle seeds and known on continental Europe as the "Stieglitz". The Goldfinch arrived in Tesmania as a cage bird and became established by escapees.

While generally described as a flock, the collective noun for a number of goldfinch is a "charm" of goldfinch and the charms of St Marys have been enhanced by the charms of goldfinch currently around the district.

Slightly smaller and slimmer than a sparrow, Goldfinches have brown backs and black wings with a broad yellow band across the wing, particularly noticeable as a flash of colour as the bird takes to the wing. The adult bird, male and female, has a brilliant red face, black crown and white around the ears and side of the neck. The underbelly is greyish white. All in all a beautifully coloured bird, although not obviously noticeable.

Goldfinches travel in flocks ("charms") except in the nesting season when they separate into pairs. They are found in gardens, on cultivated land, and in light bush. It is a weed destroyer being particularly fond of thistle and dandelion seeds. In autumn, charms can be seen moving along road verges or across paddocks, hunting for seeds, advancing over the ground in a rolling motion, with birds constantly moving over the flock from the rear to the front. feeding they flutter from plant to plant, often hanging upside down to extract the seeds.

Their song is particularly noticeable in the breeding season. The male song is a liquid twittering "Twitt, itt, itt" constant repetition making up the song. The song of the

continental bird is described as "sticklet, sticklet", hence the European name. Goldfinches have been crossed with canaries — the offspring, called 'mules' because they were infertile, were much prized as a cage bird for their song.

Their nests are works of art: neat and cup shaped, they are made with the finest twics, grasses and fibres, lined with moss, thistledown, cobwebs, lichen and other soft materials such as hair and wool.

Goldfinches have long figured in European literature, art and legend. Chaucer described the Cook in "The Canterbury Tales" as "merry as a goldfinch in the woods" ("galliard he was as a goldfynch in shawe"), Cima's "Madonna and Child" features a goldfinch fluttering in the hand of the Christ Child, while St John holds a goldfinch in his hand in Baroccio's "Holy Family". Legend holds that the little bird witnessed the crucifixion of Jesus of Nazareth and tried desperately to pull the crown of thorns from his head, leaving a spot of blood on its face, which is why the bird is especially marked to with a red face patch.

It is tempting to speculate that our local coldfinches have been descended from escapees from "Killymoon" in the early days of settlement of the Break O'Day Plains and St Patrick's Head District. Certainly large and ornate bird cages were among the chattels of "Killymoon" and the Goldfinch, or Stieglitz, would seem to have been an appropriate bird for the family.

#### **Environmental Boost for** Our East Coast

The Australian Government will spend almost \$150,000.00 on environmental problems on Tasmania's East Coast, Senator Guy Barnett said.

A total of seven projects have been The Australian approved. Governments "Envirofund" is continuing the important work of helping communities address local environmental and natural resource issues at their source.

The seven projects are:

- . A grant of \$18,007 for the Scamander Community Development Assoc. for coastal Vegetation Management.
- A grant of \$5,865 for Break O'Day Landcare and Waterwatch to buy water monitoring equipment.
- A grant of \$40,680 for Coswell Conservation Area Coast and Group to restore foreshore area near Swansea.
- A grant of \$16,800 for the Stieglitz Foreshore Group for foreshore vegetation at Georges Bay.
- A grant for \$26,470 at Peron Dunes to manage off-road recreational vehicle use.
- A grant for \$22,260 for the Seymour/Longpoint Landcare group to rehabilitate degraded farmland.
- A grant for \$17,717 for Seymour / Longpoint Landcare group for weed removal and replace with native plants.

Senator Barnett said that to date more than 400,000 Australian volunteers have been involved in more than 12,000 Natural Heritage Trust projects around the country. These projects have achieved significant outcomes, Including planting of 26 million seedlings, the protection of 7,730 kms of native vegetation and 36,000 kms of protective fencing along our waterways.



So please come along if you have any ideas concerning the arts or else you are welcome to just pop in.


