Life time of work recognised

The Tasmanian Suffolk Society made a presentation of a Life Membership to a highly regarded breeder of Suffolk sheep, at the Deloraine Show a few days ago, when they awarded Miss Jean Lohrey of Clover Banks St Marys with a Life Member badge. There are now only two Life Members in Tasmania.

Clover Banks is a property of about 400 acres, with around fifty-fifty pasture and bush. Miss Lohrey first established the Suffolk Stud in 1965 with a flock of one ram and fifteen ewes.

Over the years Miss Lohrey attended many Shows - Hobart. Launceston, Deloraine, Scottsdale, Longford, Westbury - and with much success, having won the Champion Ram and Ewe, and Champion of All Breeds at both the Hobart and Launceston. The thick swathe of ribbons is testimony to the many successful years of showing at Tasmanian Royal and Agricultural Shows.

Clover Banks Suffolk have also gone overseas, a ram and three ewes to the Emperor of Japan and a ram to Indonesia. A photo taken in 1988 shows a ewe with twin ram lambs, this wonderful ewe was never beaten at a show.

A few months ago some of the flock at Clover Banks were attacked by stray dogs, the loss and the injuries to the sheep was distressing and costly, now there are new watchdogs at the farm. Maverick and Ash are two young Alpacas who have settled in well with the sheep proving to be wonderful quards and protect their flock, any hint of trouble they will stamp their feet, circle their charges and round them up. Ash and Maverick are young wethers, Ash has recently been shorn of his fine wool, but Maverick still has his black coat. they stand out alert and watchful amongst their flock.



Melt & Mix Fruit Cake (W.W.C.B.)

A yummy, easy fruit cake suitable for any occasion (I promise you won't get tipsy!)

11/2 kg mixed fruit in rum

½ cup sherry

4 eggs

1 teaspoon mixed spice

1 Granny Smith apple

1 tablespoon honey

1 cup brown sugar -firmly packed

250 g butter - melted

11/2 cups plain flour

1/2 cup S.R. Flour

Place chopped mixed fruit in large basin, add sherry, peeled coarsely grated apple, honey, sugar and eggs. Mix well with hand or a wooden spoon. Add cooled melted butter, sifted flours and spice. Mix thoroughly, place in deep 23 cm round or deep 20 cm square tin lined with three sheets of greaseproof paper. Bring paper 5 cm above edge of tin. Bake in a slow oven (150° C) for 3½ hours or until cooked when tested. Remove from oven, brush evenly with about 2 tablespoons of extra sherry, cover tightly with foil, leave until cold. Refrigerate in plastic food wrap. Can be kept for at least 6 months.

A CLOSER LOOK AT DIABETES

Since starting in April I have seen many people newly diagnosed with diabetes and those who have had diabetes for some time. The common issue that keeps coming up is SUGAR. Sugar does not cause diabetes. It was once thought that as diabetes resulted in too much sugar in the blood, avoiding sugar was the best treatment. In fact sugar in normal serves (such as jam on toast) have no greater effect on blood sugar levels than many 'starchy' foods. Saturated fat is worse for people with diabetes. There is no special diet for people with non-insulin dependent diabetes and use of artificial sweeteners are not necessary. Effects of foods on blood glucose levels are not determined by sugar content.

If you are familiar with food labels you will notice that carbohydrate is split into two parts, total and sugars. The sugar component can be quite high even in low fat products particularly if they contain fruit or milk. Why ? Both contain natural sugars fructose in fruit and lactose in milk. This does not mean they should be avoiding foods containing fruit and milk such as fruit yoghurt and are sources of carbohydrates.

Foods that contain carbohydrate (bread, cereal and dairy products, legumes, fruit and some vegetables) once digested produce glucose (also a sugar) but at different rates some slowly, some fast.

A diet that is good for diabetes is a diet that is good for everyone! The following easy recipe is a good source of carbohydrate and also low in fat... enjoy!

Fruit and Nut Loaf

1 cup oat bran 3/4 cup currants 1 cup raisins 1/2 cup walnuts 1/2 cup dried peaches or apricots 1/2 cup plain flour 1 cup wholemeal plain flour 3 teasp baking powder 2½ cups skim milk

Combine bran, fruits and milk, cover and stand for 1 hour. Add sifted dry ingredients and nuts to bran mixture. Mix well. Transfer into non-stick loaf/cake tin. Bake in moderate oven 180° C for about 1 hour. Turn out and leave until thoroughly cold before serving.


These are the days that bring everyone together.


