Cigarettes stolen

It is an occurrence which is far from frequent in this town, but should not happen at all. The Top Shop had a substantial burglary and stealing on Sunday night which yielded thieves with a large quantity of property including cigarettes and jewellery. It is believed that the crime was committed by at least two offenders and most likely involved the use of a vehicle. It has occurred between late Sunday night and early Monday morning. Thieves have cut the phone lines which has disabled the alarm system, and forced their way through the front of the shop. This sort of crime not only affects the business operations, but is also emotionally strenuous on the victims and a huge inconvenience. 'Power of arrest' Police offences Act 1935

People need to be vigilant and keep their eyes open to help police their own community. I will remind people that they have the power of arrest under the Police Offences Act 1935. This states that if a person is caught "found offending", such as stealing your property, you have the power to arrest that person and to use reasonable force to hold that person until such time as police arrive.





Unfortunately, the law only provides for police to act on what they observe, unless someone is willing to make a written statement. And rest assured, the offending drivers are proceeded against.
