Dangerous behaviour

A dark red early model Holden Commodore sedan with three occupants, was travelling toward St Marys up the Pass at 9.15 am on Saturday

8th February when items were thrown from the vehicle toward cyclists in training. The vehicle continued on toward St Marys but it is not known where it was heading. The vehicle is not believed to be local, but any information relating to the occupants or owner of the vehicle would be greatly appreciated.

This behaviour is extremely dangerous, cyclists have little protection if they come off their bikes. The driving public are encouraged to be courteous and patient with cyclists on the road. Any offences committed by motorists endangering cyclists will be investigated and the driver/occupants proceeded against.

Having experienced a significant dry spell over summer, it is important for the driving public to be aware that rain after a dry period makes our roads initially quite slippery. Numerous road accidents occur due to this and the public are encouraged to consider this and adjust their driving behaviour accordingly.

There have been few reports of offensive language and disorderly conduct by youths of late which is good. Any member of the public who see behaviour or hear language being used, that they believe to be offensive or disorderly, should ring Police and report the matter. Any persons seen to be consuming alcohol or possessing an open container of alcohol in public places, are committing an offence and will be proceeded against. However, Police require the public to assist by notifying us when these incidents are taking place.

On the whole the past two weeks have been relatively quiet in St Marys.

Fires being lit

Property owners have a real concern for fires that are being lit with the potential to cause considerable damage and loss of property.

During last week the St Marys Fire Services were called out on two consecutive nights to fires in the Top Marshes / German Town area which appear to have been deliberately lit.

Each call out involves a minimum of three personnel per unit and can usually take at least four hours before the area is 'blacked out' and safe to leave with a minimum chance of re-ignition. The area then needs to be patrolled over the ensuing two to three days. The public is asked to keep alert and aware and to report any information to Police.

At present it is a Fire Permit period, however there is an embargo on fire permits with the exception of special circumstances.

Current fire conditions

Tasmania had a relatively late start to the fire season. Conditions continue to be dry enough in most of the State for serious fires to occur. There is considerable potential for bad fire weather. Because of these dry conditions, people should take extra care with fires in the open and be aware of fire weather warnings and total fire bans.

German Town

Over the mountains to the north-west of St Marys is the district of German Town, so called because German people were the first residents there. The flat country in its natural state was very heavily timbered but the soil being a rich chocolate was sufficient to induce the settlers to set to work and clear it.

There are only a few holdings ranging from 50 acres to 200 acres. The principal residents are Messrs. J, H and P. Lohrey who have resided in the locality for nearly 30 years. They all combine dairying with farming and also grow potatoes. Mr J. Lohrey's farm is a splendid piece of land and this year part of it yielded about 10 tons of potatoes to the acre.

The dwellings are neat and comfortable and compare favourably with those in other districts. There are two public buildings, the Church of England and State School. The nearest post office is at St Marys.

Scamander River

Midway between St Marys and St Helens is the mouth of the Scamander River which empties itself into the sea at that point. The Scamander Hotel owned by Mr Walker is the only building in the locality. The sea waters opposite the hotel teem with fish and this fact combined with the genial climate, makes it a favourite rendezvous with tourists and sportsmen.

About six miles up the river there are a few farmers. One of the most prominent is Mr Berwick who has resided there for many years. A son of his has a farm rented at St Marys which is chiefly devoted to cheese making.




