Survey shows high level of community participation

Results of a recent survey are now being released

Julia Weston, Social Worker at the St Marys Community Health Centre reports:

I've been looking at the answers to the questions; 'to which of the following club or organisation do you belong?' and 'what other activities would you like to see in this area?'.

67% of those surveyed belonged to at least one club or organisation and 19% belonged to three or more. This indicates a healthy high level of participation in the community. The clubs varied from sports clubs and service organisations to Regional Arts and Online Centre. However, to questions *'what other activities would you like to see?'* 40% gave no answer. Either they were entirely satisfied with what they have or couldn't think of anything. But an overwhelming 32% said there should be something for young people. By this they indicated children aged four to eighteen.

As a community how do we meet this challenge? If the above result is representative of the whole community, then there is widespread concern for the welfare of our young people. Kids have been surveyed ad nauseum so we know, apart from providing a number of activities there is also a need for a youth centre of some kind.

Any suggestions or offers of assistance greatly welcomed.

The survey also showed a small number of people interested in forming a garden club. So those who responded with this please leave your names with me and I'll put you in touch (as well as give you cuttings!). Any other keen gardeners out there interested in a club?

Other suggestions included a chess club, art group, show society, more sporting events, Tidy Towns group, safety houses, progress club, CWA, and indoor pool. Quite a number of people would like to see indoor bowls and cards/darts revived. Seems like a good time of the year to get this one going. Again, anyone interested contact me and we'll have a bash at getting something going.

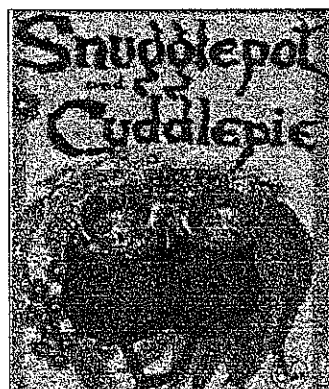

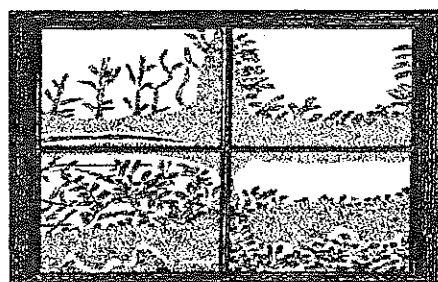

More evidence found of fox activity

A scat collected in one of the identified fox hot-spot locations has been confirmed as being from a fox, Fox Force Manager Terry Reid said last week.

Mr Reid said the scat, collected by a member of the Fox-Free Taskforce while undertaking monitoring at a site in the State's north-west earlier this month, has been confirmed.

'The scat was collected from the Burnie area and the dropping was found to contain fox grooming hairs as well as the hair of a ring-tailed possum indicating it had been devoured by the introduced predator,' he said.

'The Taskforce was following up information that had been provided to them, so this is a good indication of the important role the community has in the Fox-free program.'

Mr Reid said the exact location of the site could not be revealed until further monitoring was undertaken to determine if the fox is still using the area. The latest evidence highlighted the importance of acting before a fox population became widely established, making eradication even more difficult.

'We do not want to wait until the foxes are eating on the roadside and are highly visible before we decide it is time to take action, because by then it will be likely to be too late,' he said.

Mr Reid said a baiting program would be the primary eradication focus, backed up by hunters, landowners and managers.

'The baiting campaign will be based on information gathered by the teams in the field.'

'As well as targeting identified hotspots it will include likely areas of fox habitation to ensure we have the greatest chance of success.

'Because we are in the fortunate position of having a very small fox population, any fox kill will have a big impact.'

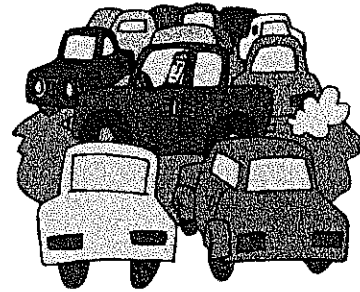

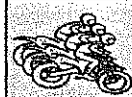

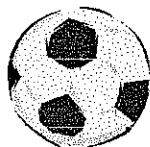
