

Last Train Departing: 12.45 pm Tuesday 4th May 2004

Cranes, trucks and a hive of activity at the St Marys Railway Station signaled the departure of the X 30 train as it was loaded up to be transported to its new home with Derwent Valley Rail where it will be given a complete rebuild ready for use on scenic tourist excursions.

The X 30 was purchased from the State Government many years ago by the Lions Club of St Marys and was driven to St Marys and 'parked' at the railway station, St Marys Lions had visions of running short train trips between St Marys and Cullenswood Station but this did not happen as the track was removed and the train was left sitting. Over the years the X 30 suffered badly from vandalism and then because of the onus of liability, the Club made the decision to sell the train by Tender and use the money towards a playground in St Marys.

Several tenders were received, most were for scrapping the X 30, but the Lions Club Members sold to Derwent Valley Rail because of a guarantee by them to have the train completely restored for use within Tasmania.

This train is the last of its type left, so it is a real piece of history. We look forward to seeing the X 30 back in use, proudly displaying the logo of the Lions Club of St Marys.



Equipment Grants to support our local volunteers

Government funding of \$26,000 will allow 16 community organisations to purchase much needed equipment.

Five groups in our area were amongst those to receive funding as follows:

'The funding will be used to purchase a wide range of equipment' Senator Watson said.

2082 volunteer organisations across Australia have been allocated up to \$5,000 to purchase a wide variety of small equipment items.

'The amount of interest this year was fantastic and it follows on from the 1,400 community organisations that received funding from Volunteer Small Equipment Grants in the 2003 program'.

'Each purchase will make a significant difference to the work of volunteers, and is equipment that organisations may not have been able to otherwise afford.'

The latest round of funding is the fifth time the Australian Government has committed its financial support to volunteers since 2001, bringing the total funding to over \$19 million, distributed to approximately 8,500 community organisations.

The Australian Government is committed to supporting the important work volunteers do for the community'. Senator Watson said.



Assessing and Reporting against the Essential Leanings

Since 2000 Tasmanian government schools have been involved in a major curriculum reform. This reform was in response to concerns and issues about curriculum content, teaching methods, student learning and assessing and reporting as well as societal changes of the twenty-first century.

A main focus of the reform has been on co-construction, that is, at every stage of the process key stakeholders, including parents, have been involved in determining the direction that the curriculum reform will take.

To date, some of the Key Milestones in the Curriculum Consultation have been:

Community Consultation - Values and Purposes of Education	2000
Values and Purposes Statement	2000
Co-construction of Essential Learnings Framework 1	2001
Launch of Essential Learnings Framework 1 March	2002
Student Outcomes Development	2002-2004
Launch of Essential Learnings Framework 2 March	2003
Launch of Learning, Teaching and Assessment Guide April	2003

Lifelong learning is a key goal of the project and the intended outcomes include:

- improved student learning
- improved engagement of students in their learning
- improved cultural and structural conditions in schools, related to learning
- increased selection and use of teaching practices
- improved communication and collaboration between childcare, parents and schools.

The Essential Learnings are now being implemented in all schools and from 2005, teachers will be assessing and reporting student achievement against these which will mean changes to the way student reports are written.

The Minister for Education has approved a transition plan for assessing and reporting to assist schools and parents to adjust to the new requirements. Parent forums are being held across the state to inform you about the changes and to get your opinion on draft reporting formats. The department is seeking your valued input and invite you to attend one of these forums which have been sanctioned by the Tasmanian State Council of Parents and Friends Associations.





ANZAC DAY SERVICE

As is being seen at services around Australia, there was a good attendance at both the Dawn Service and the 11 am Service at the St Marys Cenotaph. The beautiful crisp autumn morning allowed the service to be held outdoors and a crowd of about one hundred joined in the service conducted by Peter Rubenach.

Peter spoke of Love and Peace, "Love must go beyond politics, beyond countries, beyond religion. It is in the heart of almost every person on earth to want love and peace. Let us maintain the love and peace the men and women we remember today died and sacrificed for. First love and peace must start in our own lives, then in the family, the community and beyond."

Deputy Mayor Margaret Osborne representing the Break O'Day Council spoke of remembering those who went to war to fight for their country's freedom and more recently those who are serving in Iraq and Afghanistan.

In an address by lan Summers, he recalled the importance of ANZAC Day when he was a young boy in Launceston and growing up without a father and the great friendship of his many uncles and especially the wonderful support from Legacy. In particular lan remembered the day a gentleman from Legacy collected him from the classroom and took him to look over an A-class submarine - much to the envy of the other students! "All this demonstrates the importance of family, friends and others and having an optimistic outlook on life. When there is trouble, join with others and you can succeed".

The message that came through all the speakers was about love, peace, helping each other through adversity and the freedom of living in this country.

Our next game will be against St Pats Green on Saturday May 8th at Perth.


