St Helens water quality

Break O'Day Mayor Stephen Salter has welcomed confirmation from the Director of Public Health Dr Roscoe Taylor of the conclusion of all health related investigations carried out by the Public and Environmental Health Service in relation to concerns about the safety of St Helens water supply.

Dr Taylor has confirmed that analysis of cancer data and data about a group of conditions known as connective tissue disorders (such as rheumatoid arthritis) did not reveal any indication of abnormal disease patterns or public health issues.

In his letter dated 20 March 2005, Dr Taylor indicated that his Department has sought independent advice from Associate Professor Malcolm Sim, an environmental and occupational health specialist of Monash University Department of Social and Preventative Medicine.

Professor Sim has advised that there is no pattern or commonality to the range of neurological conditions examined and there is no suggestion or likelihood of any toxicological cause.

Dr Taylor has commended Council on its practice of publishing the data about water quality issues as transparency about water issues is important in enabling the community to have confidence in the integrity of the water management system.

Dr Taylor has authorised Council to release that information for publication and a full copy of the letter will be published on the Council's website.

In summary, the town drinking water supply at St Helens has been demonstrated to be safe and there is no evidence to suggest any public health threat.

Dr Taylor has recommended that following the completion of the current monthly sampling program in June, that Council continues an appropriate monitoring regime based on the appraisal of the catchment and in keeping with the latest version of the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines.



Please Note:

There are however specific restrictions on where chainsaws and off-road/recreational vehicles may be used. There are maximum noise levels which apply to all power tools, chainsaw and lawn mowers manufactured after 1st January 1975

If you are annoyed by noise.

If you are annoyed by noise created by neighbours, there are a number of approaches you can take. The first thing to do is try to solve the problem amicably by talking it over with the person causing the noise. Often they will not have realised they are causing you a problem and in many cases they will be only too happy to do what they can to help.

Formal Action!

Formal action may be necessary where the noise is a current problem. You may lodge an individual complaint or where the noise affects a number of neighbours a combined complaint, with your local Council.

Council has the power

Council has the power to investigate and ease many of the offensive noise problems in the community.

Under the provisions of the Environment Management and Pollution Control Act, Council can serve a notice or an on the spot fine on the occupier of land from which a noise nuisance is emanating.

If the noise is a 'one off' problem (especially at night) you should consider contacting the local Police. Should you require any assistance or further information, please do not hesitate to contact Council.





CORNWALL NEWS From Jim Haas

If some one had written in the Valley Voice a couple of years ago that a house at Cornwall would bring a price topping a hundred thousand dollars most people would have made the same comment I would have made "In your dreams, Mate". But it looks like its about to happen, the old Walter and Doris Haas residence at 24 John St. is for sale for \$137,000. If this house gets anywhere near that price it will far exceed the record of ninety-odd thousand reported to have been paid for the old managers residence a year ago.

David and Geraldine McKendrick currently own 24 John St. and in their short time at Cornwall have fitted in like 'Old Timers' and have been good friends to all. David was born and bred in Belfast, Northern Ireland and Geraldine is a Hobart girl and whilst they are full of praise for their time at Cornwall, Geraldine has a deteriorating health problem and needs to be close to specialist doctors and family, as a result they are moving to Hobart.

Although 24 John St. has been extensively renovated recently and almost unrecognisable these days, it was originally lovingly built by my uncle and long time President of the Coal Miners' Union and passionate Labour Party supporter, Walter 'Mat'" Haas. For a life time the Haas's lived there with their two daughters Valerie and Cavel, both of whom died before their parents. The unique Christian name Cavel, was chosen because she was born about the time Edith Cavel the British nurse who in Belgium in the early part of World War One became famous for helping Allied soldiers escape the German Armies. Walter died in 1980 at the age of 85 leaving memories of a tall, strong-willed man who splintered many a table when he thumped his fist down to emphasise a point about his beloved politics. Doris lived there alone for another ten years until her death in 1990, at age ninety. In 1991 the house was sold by her grandchildren, Robert Hall and Helen Jones of Launceston, and has since had several owners, each one adding their own personal touch.

Like all the homes on Cornwall, if the walls could talk we would have enough stories to fill an encyclopaedia. Well, perhaps a censored one!

Since the publicity created by Mrs Camplin and her Miners' Heritage Wall the interest shown in Cornwall is nothing short of amazing. Rumours even have it that a couple of people are interested in building here. This has not happened since the late nineteen fifties when Les Nolan and Ralph "Skelly" Strochnetter built the house in Alexander St. now owned by Steven Targett.

Whilst it often appears that Government bodies tend to want to forget about small communities, most of them, like Cornwall are alive and well, offering a tranquil lifestyle people in large towns and cities can only dream about.

Walter Haas and his family are long gone but his skilled workmanship lives on in 24 John St. and I'm sure it will reach that record price and set a trend for the future.
