Logging coupes targeted by thieves

I referred to diesel and property thefts from logging coupes in the district in the last Valley Voice. Since then there have been a further two thefts.

Between 9th July 2004 and 12th July 2004, 15,000 litres of diesel was stolen from a logging coupe near Rossarden. Also tools, grease guns, a temperature and wind gauge along with a UHF radio were stolen from equipment at another logging coupe near Mathinna between 3rd July 2004 and 5th July 2004.

The theft of a blue Scorpion Work Station, comprising a welder, compressor and generator also occurred at Mathinna between 7th June 2004 and 14th June 2004. This has only recently been reported to Police. The item stolen was from a shed on a farm.

Closer to home, recent loutish behaviour in St Marys has resulted in broken windows in the Post Office and damage to public seating opposite the Hotel. The verandah area of the Post Office is private property and as such in not open to the public when the Post Office is closed. In the past, problems have occurred with youths loitering after hours in this area and it appears these problems are arising once again.

Again I ask for your assistance in identifying offenders in any of these matters

Recently there was an instance of dogs attacking sheep in Cornwall. This sort of incident leaves the owner of the dogs liable to quite large monetary fines up to, and in some cases exceeding \$1000.00. It is also an offence to have a dog wandering around in a public place when not under effective control of its owner. This alone can make the owner liable for a fine up to \$500.00.

St Helens sewerage upgrade

Break O'Day Mayor Stephen Salter has expressed concern at Council's ability to raise sufficient funds for the construction of the new St Helens sewerage treatment plant.

"We are committed to upgrading the treatment plant and have focused on the highest level of technology currently available that has been used on Magnetic Island in Queensland. This level of treatment would give Council the option of irrigating sports grounds and gardens within the St Helens area without the costs associated with lower standard effluent."

Mayor Salter said that Council's consultants had been negotiating with the lowest tenderers but it appears that the lowest achievable cost is in excess of \$2.8M. While Council has set aside a significant amount of money for this project, it is simply not possible for a community the size of St Helens to come up with this amount of money.

Council is aware that the State Government has included in the budget for the current year \$11M for water and sewerage infrastructure required as a result of the impact of tourism. Council has applied to the Government to access funds under this program and is anxious for some decisions to be made. Tenders closed on the 23rd April 2004 and if some decisions are not made within the next two weeks, the costs may increase even further.



Launceston needs lunchtime Qantas flight says Michael Ferguson

Qantas must prove its lasting commitment to Launceston by adding a lunchtime flight to its daily schedule says Michael Ferguson.

"I welcome Jetstar's consideration of such a service, but the prevailing speculation is that Qantas will cease its 6.30 am Launceston service, and for that matter all Tasmanian services within a year.

"Qantas must quash this speculation because it is destructive for both commerce and tourism in Northern Tasmania. "A second daily service at lunchtime to fill a void of more than eight hours during the day, apart from a solitary Virgin Blue flight, would certainly quash such speculation." Mr Ferguson said.

"While the speculation persists I would not be surprised to see both Qantas and Jetstar lose more market share to Virgin." he said.

"I commend the lobbying business group Fairness and Equality in Airline Travel led by Joanne Wolff, for their doggedness in ensuring Qantas and Jetstar provide satisfactory services," he said.

The number of students missing school each day has been a concern to our school for some time. We now have data which backs up our concerns.


In 2002 St Marys District High School had the second highest overall absentee rate of all District High Schools in the Esk District. In 2003 the figures were a little better but we still had a total absentee rate of 8.92%. This figure represents 35 students being absent each day.

In the coming weeks we will provide parents with information regarding attendance and implement a number of initiatives. These will include:

- Provide parents with an education pamphlet
- Educate students about the effects of absenteeism
- Contact parents by phone initially, of students who have a high absenteeism rate or a long period of absence
- Discuss with staff ways to reduce absenteeism
- Collate all known data and address the findings

Look out for further information. Remember working together we can overcome this problem and help improve the educational opportunity for many students.

Break O'Day Community Neuropsychology Service

Many people who have a chronic medical or physical condition such as an acquired brain injury, stroke, Multiple Sclerosis, Lymphoedema or cardiac disease also suffer from a range of neurological or psychological problems. Impaired memory functioning, depression, anxiety, sleep disturbance, grief, anger and relationship difficulties are commonly experienced.

In order to assist people in the Break O' Day municipality who may be suffering from these conditions, The University of Tasmania Department of Rural Health and School of Psychology have collaborated with the Tasmanian Lymphoedema Centre Inc. and the Department of Health and Human Services to provide an innovative clinical neuropsychology service to the area. Over the past 12 months, postgraduate clinical psychology students have completed 3-5 month internships, gaining invaluable experience in working in a rural setting whilst providing a free service to the Break O'Day community. The project has also involved the development of resources and facilitating workshops to support groups and health professionals in the Break O'Day area. The "What About Me" series of workshops held earlier in the year proved to be extremely popular with the community, with approximately 40 health professionals and support volunteers attending.

The current interns, Ty Dawson and Louise Dewis are both thoroughly enjoying the opportunity to work in the Break O'Day area. "As well as providing a wonderful opportunity to develop expertise in clinical practice and neuropsychological assessment, I am really enjoying working in a close-knit community setting" Louise said.

The service, which is free, is currently operating in St Marys and St Helens on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Ty and Louise would like to speak to any community members, health professionals or coordinators of support groups who would like more information about the service or to make a referral. 
