Many people who grow cannabis will more than often grow more than they can use themselves and sell the remainder to cover cost involved or to have a main or second income. It is very disheartening to see those who have been caught and charged with growing cannabis, have no concern for those to whom they may sell it to, as long as they can make a dollar or two.

The use of cannabis has a wider effect within the community than just merely the selling or buying of it, many find that once they have used it for any length of time they are unable to go without. This results in homes being burgled and people resorting to committing other offences to obtain money so they can afford their habit.

In most cases police would not know of any drug selling/growing without the help of the public and any information that we receive is always kept confidential.

"...In addition, various springs provide water for both domestic (drinking water and production of electricity) and agricultural/horticultural use in Dublin Town, German Town and Gardiner's Creek. It is also the catchment area for Newman's Creek which is a back up for the St Marys water supply".

I hope this clarifies any confusion which may have arisen from the typographical error.
