
#### Huge surprise for Leith!

#### A little bit of Heritage by Jim Haas

When we reminisce on how our Forefathers tunneled into the Mt. Nicholas Range with only a pick, shovel and a stick of dynamite, we remember a breed of brave men all of whom knew only hard physical work with daylight in winter being only a weekend luxury.

But this unique style of coalmining began to change in 1950 when Cornwall Coal Co. purchased one of the first five Joy Continuous Miners to come to Australia from the United States at a cost of 50,000 pounds; a huge amount at that time.

Ding Mc Geachie, the mine superintendent at the time said: "If we are to compete with the continuing threat of cheaper oil, the whole structure of mining as Lindsey Haas admires the 'Joy Miner', after she had dug her way we know it has to change and mechanisation with machines such as these is our only hope of survival."



out of the mountain at Cornwall.

The next twenty years proved him right, as the coal industry almost folded in the 1960s.

But in 1950 when the new pre-historic looking machine arrived at Cornwall, the industry was still going strong and despite fears amongst the miners that this steel monster was going to do away with jobs, the mammoth task of taking the machine into the Snake Gully coal seam was achieved, and although pick and shovel contract miners were still used, the Joy Continuous Miner became the major coal producer at Cornwall for the remainder of the Snake Gully seam's life.

Whilst its system of cutting and loading the coal was similar to the modern continuous miners, unlike today's method of transporting the coal from coal face to conveyor belt with electrically powered shuttle cars, Cornwall mine was still bringing the coal to the surface by endless rope pulling small rail trucks called skips. As a result, rails had to be kept laid right up to the machine to allow it to load the coal into the skips, where pit ponies were still used to pull the skips to where they could be coupled to the endless rope which then pulled them to the surface.

But then in February 1964, the decision was made to close Cornwall and move all operations to the more efficient Duncan Mine at Fingal and the Joy Miner, which was now buried some three kilometers under the Mt. Nicholas Range, was a valuable item; she was the last one left of the five originals brought to Australia; the others had either been buried in rock falls or dismantled for spare parts.

Consequently, a mainland company bought the machine, to be transported to Sydney as part of a mining museum. But the question of how to get the machine out from under the mountain proved quite a head ache. However, it was finally decided that the shortest route was to dig her way five hundred metres to the south which would bring her out roughly where Blackwood Colliery is today.

A crew of four men was retained at Cornwall for the task and long time mine deputy, Lindsey Haas, was put in charge of the operation.

It was a tedious operation. As the Miner made her path, the road behind had to be kept clear, so the coal had to be taken back in skips and dumped in every nook and cranny of the mine. But after a couple of months her big teeth finally hit daylight and the great monster emerged from under the mountain into the rain forest, her well worn cutting head feeling the rays of sunlight after fourteen years of darkness.

But the battered and worn old machine had served her time. Like all old miners her days of darkness, coal dust and cursing men driving her to the limits were over; she could relax now in the knowledge that she would be restored, painted, face lifted and be a showpiece for generations to come.

But we too should never forget the old "Dinosaur", because the cost efficiency of mechanisation saved the industry from the cheap oil of the sixties, and has kept the coalmining viable ever since.

Otherwise, it too, would only be a relic like the Joy Miner.



#### St Marys Police report

As the Christmas New Year period is approaching rapidly it is probably time for a gentle reminder of safety on the roads.

This is especially so in this region as there will be a high usage of traffic using the highways to reach holiday resorts and destinations. This increased traffic flow also sees a higher police profile and presence on the roadways, not only by local police, but specialist traffic police from Launceston.

Police over the holiday periods will be concentrating on the non-compliance of drivers and passengers not wearing seat belts, speeding and drink driving. These three factors feature in fatal and serious crashes and all attempts will be made to prevent fatal and serious crashes in our area.

Several Random Breath Testing Operations conducted in our town over the past weeks have caught motorists driving whilst disqualified and exceeding 0.05%. What is the motto? "DRINK DRIVE – BLOODY IDIOT"

Why lose your licence for a few beers. Have a designated driver or someone pick you up. In a country area a licence is essential with no public transport, so think before you get behind the wheel.

Also for information, is a new law brought in about 2 months ago concerning drinking alcohol on the streets. If a person is consuming alcohol or has an open container of alcohol on a public street you can be issued with a \$100 on the spot fine. Several have been warned in the past week, so keep the drinking indoors.
