

Fingal Valley 1881

In the Nineteenth Century a number of books were written about Van Diemens land with the idea in mind to entice immigrants to come to what was described as a land full of promise and opportunity. Indeed, in the 1820s the population increased from 5,468 in 1820, to 24,279 by the end of that decade, with free immigrants making up the bulk of this increase.

The first book, which was written by Thomas Godwin in 1823, is now quite rare and worth \$10,000 plus. The cover displays a painting of Hobart Town with Mt Wellington in the background and three large kangaroos in the foreground.

The book would have been standard reading for many of the thousands of immigrants who came to Van Diemens Land in the 1820's and 30's, because it gave them a full description of the land as well as articles on sheep, land clearing, cost of labour, cattle prices, commerce and much detail on the ordinary mechanics of living.

Another book simply called "Thomas' Guide Book to Tasmania", printed in 1881, has a chapter on the Fingal Valley and goes on to say: ".....It is doubtful if such another dreary, monotonous spot exists than The Corners. There is nothing but a dismal stretch of sheep run, and the still more dreary hotel, whose proprietor and those about him have become hopelessly infected with the prevailing gruesome air of the detested spot.

At Avoca there is a stopping place to change the horses at a roadside stable and a little further on is an antiquated ruined dwelling. It is known as "The Haunted House". A horrible murder was committed there in the early days of the colony, and no one would live in it on account of the nightly vibration of the ghost of the murdered man.


At Killymoon, the mansion just discernable through the poplar and other acclimatised trees, is on the right of the road. It is the largest and most imposing structure in the district and now the residence of Mr. R. Ransom Esq. The property's founder was the late Baron von Stieglitz who was evidently a man of architectural taste and one is strongly reminded of much that characterizes the structures of mediaeval times. The freestone for this building was quarries at the foot of the hills close by.

Cullenswood, the old home of the Legge family, gives its name to this part of the Break O'Day Valley. Some cottages, a church and cemetery, and some cultivated fields, are the chief points of interest in this part of the valley, which was once a great hiding place for the various gangs of bushrangers whose lookouts were on the lofty heights on either side of the valley, whence without being seen, they could see all that was going on below......"

One would have thought there would have been more points of interest in the Fingal Valley in 1881 than what was reported in Thomas' guide. St Thomas Church, Avoca, St Peters Church, Fingal, St Mary Catholic Church, Cullenswood, all of which were well established by then. Plus properties such as Simon Lord's "Bona Vista", James Grant's "Tullochgorum", William Talbot's "Malahide" and Francis Groom's "Harefeild" to name a few should have been worthy of a mention.

He did, however, go on to say that coaches ran twice a week into the valley from Campbell Town. The population for the Fingal Valley was around 2000. There were 8,060 acres in cultivation, 934 horses, 6,794 horned cattle, 115, 963 sheep, 35 goats and 2,064 pigs.

The member for the Legislative Council was the Hon. F. M. Innes and John Swan was the member for the House of Assembly.

Some 70+ people attended the information afternoon at Kings Meadows Medical Centre and 40+ were assessed in St Marys.




NEW SHOP NOW OPEN

WELCOME COMMITTEE INQUIRY INTO BUSHFIRES

Greens' Amendment Ensures it Will Cover ALL Public Lands Including State Forests

The Tasmanian Greens last week welcomed the tripartisan support for a motion, moved by the Liberal Opposition and successfully amended by the Greens, to request the Joint

Tasmania might be better prepared for, and improve the response to, the bushfire threat.

Greens Shadow Emergency Services spokesperson Tim Morris MHA said that the motion will ask the ERD Committee to draw up its own terms of reference, but was given guidance on the type of matters that it should consider and on which to submit recommendations.

"The Greens' amendment, which was accepted, expanded the scope of the proposed inquiry into including all public lands, which would include State Forests, rather than just National parks and reserves," Mr Morris said.

"Our amendment also clarified that the intent of the motion was for the Joint House Committee to develop its own specific terms of reference for this inquiry, but to utilise the motion as guidance on the type of matters that the inquiry should cover."



Healthy Community Project Art Exhibition



BREAK O'DAY VIEWS ON THE PROPOSED PULP MILL

Robert Legge, Mayor of Break O'Day Council released a survey last week, conducted by Hobart's EMRS, gauging the views of Break O'Day residents in relation to the proposed Pulp Mill in Northern Tasmania.

The results were a majority of 52%, together with a further 3% who indicated conditional support. 41% were not in favour, and 5% were unsure.

Mayor Legge said that the survey was important to assist the Councillors in considering this issue, and the survey which has been conducted under the relevant Code of Practice, is approximately 96.5% accurate.

The Mayor indicated that the support for the mill was stronger amongst older people.

Some interesting statistics are that females were marginally more in favour than males, while those against were mostly higher number males than females.

In terms of the main towns, Beaumaris was opposed with 30% and 55% against, Binalong Bay had 58% in favour and 33% against, Fingal had 55% in favour and 40% against, Scamander had 52% in favour and 38% against, St Helens had 58% in favour and 35% against, St Marys had 57% in favour and 41% against and Stieglitz had 52 % in favour with 33% against.

Those who indicated conditional support across the range were 42% and those unsure were 95%.

The Annual Bowls Dinner is in April, and the Association Dinner will be held here in May, so keep an eye out for them.


ST MARYS PREMIERS ECBA 2006/07. GOOD ISN'T IT?
