

FRIDAY DELUGE FOR ST MARYS Jim Haas

Well there's no doubt about it the East Coast of Tasmania and the township of St Marys experience some of the most extreme weather conditions in the country. From an unusually dry, period in 2006 which contributed to one of Tasmania's worst bushfires, to rains in 2010 that saw record falls of over 200 millimetres in twenty four hours.

Whilst floods are almost an annual occurrence in St Marys, never before have we seen the main street turned into a raging river in Homes and businesses were flooded with up to a metre of water going through

the way it did last Friday evening. Faulkner's garage, and Manna Farm was almost totally destroyed.



By seven o'clock there was a slight ease in the weather and the township of St Marys was a hive of activity. Travellers from far and wide had

Margison's Creek bridge. landed in St Marys and had nowhere else to go, because all roads out of the town were closed. St Marys Pass closed mid-afternoon, followed soon after by the Elephant Pass, and the Esk Main Road closed towards nightfall.

By Saturday morning the town was almost back to normal, except for the few unfortunate victims who were left with a cleanup and damage bill totalling thousands of dollars.

We have to go back to 1974, when sheets of bitumen were washed off the Esk Main Road near Cullenswood Church and the St Marys wood vard, to find a downfall of rain that would compare with Friday. Let us hope it's at least another 36 or more years before we see it again.

Once upon a time there was no such thing as movies, televisions or computers. You don't remember you say? Well there aren't too many people left who do remember a time when we were not controlled by the electronic media.

For those of us who do, however, many fond memories come to mind of a time when we had to make our own fun. It was a time when we could let our kids roam free around the bush making cubby houses in the tee-tree, building dams in the creeks and in the May school holidays we would spend our days dragging gum bows to build a bon-fire for cracker night.

The only stipulation the parents put on the kids was to check in at meal time.

One of the main weekly events for the adults in those days was a dance on Friday or Saturday nights. Local musicians would get together and form an orchestra that could belt out a tune that would set toes tapping and every man racing to lead his favourite lady onto the dance floor.

The floor boards of the town halls would rattle as everyone involved themselves in Fox trots, waltzes, barn dances and the hocky-pokie until at the end of the night a mass of sweaty but fulfilled bodies would indulge in a home cooked supper.

Even before community halls were built, weekend get-togethers, which would incorporate dancing, were a big part of the entertainment of our early settlers. Back then it would simply be a gathering at someone's home and the music would be nothing more than a fiddle or two, with a wind jammer thrown in. But that would be more than enough to get everyone in the spirit to spend the night twirling in dance with their partner.

Early records show that many a dance was held at the larger properties in the area like "Cullenswood", "Killymoon" and "Malahide", with the "Benham Ball" at Avoca being famous for many years. To add to this, organisations like the Catholic and Anglican churches would hold an annual fund raising ball along with the hospital and school etc.

This year as part of the Grassy Bottom Regional Arts Winter Solstice they are bringing back the tradition of bush dancing in the hope that it may take off on a regular basis so we can all kick up our heels and enjoy an activity full of laughter, exercise and fellowship. At the end of the night, when you sit down with friends to enjoy a hearty supper, you will feel as if your day has been worthwhile.

The Tasmanian Heritage Fiddle Ensemble, which is made up of a dozen or so musicians of all ages, will be here ready to kick off the dance at 7.30 pm on Saturday the 19th June. They will not only play some of the best heritage music you have ever heard, but call the dances and teach you the steps.

A display of photos from the dances of days gone by will be part of the night and of course the night will end with the traditional supper.

So come along and experience how our ancestors entertained themselves without the help of modern day gadgets. But just a word of warning, the experience could move you into pursuing a new way of life.



The Say Cagerattler

What an extraordinary day we had last Friday May 28th. Little did we know when the rain started earlier that it would lead to what it did. Just shows you what can happen.

At about 2.45 pm we had that massive deluge that flooded drains, overflowed gutters and saturated anyone with the misfortune to be caught out in it. Then it backed off for the best part of an hour before the really heavy stuff hit again. Then,

as they say, all hell broke loose over the next few hours. This then led to damage all over town.

The most amazing thing about all this though, and genuinely not overstating the fact, is how lucky it was that nobody died or were seriously injured. THANKFULLY. Can you imagine how incredibly lucky the young group from Trevallyn were who could so easily have all been drowned when they were caught on Margison's Bridge with water gushing in around the windscreen. A massive effort by Coxy and one of the local police officers who amazingly had the presence of mind to get through with Coxy's dozer to help out. Truly fantastic effort.

I met the group on Saturday at Gone Rustic. When you consider a five month old went through this too, you can

understand why the young mother and father were so pleased to be able to talk to the media about it all.

Not only this happened of course. We had near misses on the Passes, a similarly lucky women at Bicheno whose car was washed off the road, with her in it, and one of my friends who works at the school who somehow managed to get through the Harefield Road intersection flooding with water coming over the bonnet of her car. All she was trying to do was to bring necessary items through, but so quickly did the water rise that she was literally floating, briefly.

A few minutes later when she made it through to the school she was still in shock as to what had happened. I'd passed that same point 15 minutes earlier and there was no water over the road until I started going up the school drive. That's how quickly a metre high wall of water can arrive. Both of us spent the next 45 minutes contemplating how to get home. A well known local got through with his four wheel drive to help out. I ended up waiting for a while and brought my car back through nervously around 7pm but...

It wasn't until Saturday morning that the heartbreak of damage to businesses, private properties and some infrastructure was to be seen. All from a relatively brief flash flood, when it's all said and done. To anyone who has been impacted we must try to help out somehow especially if insurance cannot be accessed. I know we will because that is what makes this

town special. We always do.

A big request in particular for Manna Farm. They've lost their livelihood entirely it seems, through no fault of their own and due to the nature of the plant /supplies business it can't be fully insured. IS THERE A WAY WE CAN HELP OUT SOMEHOW UNTIL THEY CAN GET BACK ON THEIR FEET? I have no doubt there is, if these fellows want to continue. Let's

hope they do.

To all those who suffered property loss, face replacements, insurance claims and inconvenience, so sorry to hear and to our S.E.S., Police, Firey's, Ambo's, Council and DIER Road crews and Aurora. Thanks. Blood's worth bottling. Thanks again too, to Coxy and the dozer. How great was that?

Finally, even though I am a keen supporter of the memorial park idea, may I state that I am **NOT** the instigator of the petition currently in circulation.

Local Artist's Work Selected

St. Marys might be a small town, in a rural corner of Australia's island state, but it is exciting that our local artists have the opportunity for recognition for their work, AND for their town.
