The walk led by Henry, and the history explained

by Barry & Greg, was greatly accepted by 21 people, some who have not been here for very long, and others who have been around for a while, but all found it a very interesting day, hearing about the things that used to be in St Marys.

The walk took in from the woodyard to the west, which used to be the Jubilee Coal siding, which once received the coal by overhead cable and buckets, via Rosegarland and Balaclava and it was also the loading site for coal from the mines at Dalmain and Seymour.

We then proceeded to the railway station, where most were amazed to find out that the original Cheese factory was over the road, opposite

the railway station. Then we worked our way up the main street, and Greg Chapman gave a little insight into when his Grandfather Ted Chapman worked the old bakery beside the e.ScaPe Gallery. Some of the old bakery is still there to-day.

We then viewed the old school site and some photos of some of the old establishments along the way. Had lunch in the park at the Library, then

to the old swimming pool site and to opposite the Top Shop where we discussed that area. People were amazed at the number of halls and butcher shops that were in this once very vibrant town.


The walk finished in Story or Storey street (note both the spellings just to cover myself) right back where we started about five hours earlier, most were exhausted but felt it was very worthwhile.





Holy Trinity Anglican Church Community Dinner


Every community needs a time and place to come together. This is especially true during challenging days. What better way to do this than with warm food, around tables in friendship and laughter and connectedness.

After an amazing summer the Sea Scouts are looking forward to a great year in 2012.


This summer they didn't spend much time at home- they had a week in Trevallyn





Five Pillars of the Tasmanian Future Economy

Today I outlined the Liberals' economic blueprint for a self-reliant Tasmania.





The Say Cagerattler

Can you believe that once upon a time Tasmania used to have a vibrant, financially beneficial and obviously sustainable timber industry? Then the environmentalists turned up.

So many job losses, lost markets, confusion, weak knee governments of all persuasions has led now to what seems to be a downward spiralling industry.

I'm so disappointed with the Regional Forest Agreement because it's underselling this potentially great industry that, in a large part Tasmania was built on, almost literally.

Just to try to attempt to appease the "tree huggers" as they are colloquially described, these payouts and agreements are being put together. The Government as much as the Greenies perhaps need to consider the long term ramifications of the decisions they are making right now.

Trees are sustainable and renewable. It happens in nature doesn't it? Tree seed pods burst open, seeds scatter, some take root, they continue to grow, sometimes to big ages and then one day they die and fall to the forest floor and rot down into the ground again. It's finite. It's been happening for millions of years. In the timber industry the process speeds up somewhat... They plant the trees, grow them for a period of time, harvest them whilst the trees are of value and then after they're gone they regenerate the area again.


Some areas have been through this process a few times in our history. Long gone are the days of clear falling and walking away from vast tracts of denuded land. That's a reality. I believe that part of a forest operation is an extensive assessment of ecological/flora/fauna impact before work commences. It makes me wonder who the REAL CONSERVATIONISTS are. It's in their best interests to look after the area as best as possible to provide future harvests.

There are very special areas that need to be protected of course. The Tarkine, The South West Wilderness, The Franklin and Gordon River and a few other places that have such complex bio diversity that logging wouldn't or shouldn't be an option and all parties agree on that.

For the rest though I fail to see why the timber industry can't continue to provide employment, development and sustainability well into the future. Rather than cutting jobs there could and should be expansion of this industry provided all the necessary environmental boxes are ticked on the process... Surely it can't be that hard.

It's well and good for the greenies to talk about environmental vandalism and so on, but what about the economic vandalism they are contributing to when our trees just live and die with not much benefit to anyone in many cases. We haven't even touched on the radiata pine plantation issues and the impacts there, but before it's too late all parties need to (for the first time perhaps) sit down and have meaningful discussions and it must include everyone that has genuine concerns for this massively important part of our State. A full-on forum must happen sooner rather than later.



RULES - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

- 1. Each entry thereof to be a maximum of 1.5 metres high. For safety reasons (required by Aurora), any entry which is higher than 1.5 metres will be disqualified.
- 2. Each entry to be made from fibre, textile and stitch. Embellishments may be added, but must not protrude more than 1 cm for safety reasons. No sharp items please. No nails, pins or tacks.
- 3. Entry should not have any loose or flapping parts, for safety reasons (required by Aurora).
- 4. Entries must be in place by 9 a.m. Saturday and not taken home until 5 p.m. Sunday. Entries may be temporarily removed between 5 p.m. Saturday and 9 a.m. Sunday for security reasons; this will be the responsibility of the entrant. Entry must be back in place no later than 9 a.m. Sunday. If entries are left out all night this will be at entrant's own risk.
- 5. Entries should be robust and able to withstand wind and rain (although we hope the weather will be fine, we can't guarantee it!) They should also be securely wrapped around the pole.
- 6. Twenty entries only will be selected for display; the selection process will be at the discretion of the GET committee, and the decision will be final. No discussion will be entered into.
- 7. Winners announced at 4 pm on Saturday 2 June at Gone Rustic Studio & Gallery, 37 Main Street, St. Marys, Tas.: 7215; refreshments provided.

SWIMMING POOL NEWS

Since opening as an indoor facility in December, the swimming pool has seen a steady increase in use as summer moved along and especially after the successful School Association's Learn to Swim Programme. As with any new facility, over time some 'teething issues' have become apparent and we hope to work through these as part of our continuous improvement program for the pool. We would therefore ask for your patience and co-operation as we work through these issues. We would also like to take this opportunity remind you of some of the rules and etiquette as well as progress around improving the facility.

DRAINAGE - Many of our pool users have been concerned about a number of areas in the enclosure where the water gathers and does not drain away. We are happy to advise that over the coming weeks this will be addressed and modifications made to ensure that the water is able to drain away in the most affected areas.

DOOR TO CHANGE ROOMS - please remember that this door forms part of the pool enclosure and therefore in the interests of safety MUST REMAIN CLOSED AT ALL TIMES. While we do recognise that it is inconvenient to have to walk around to the front door, it is a condition of your signed pool agreement that this door remain closed. Therefore we ask that you do not prop the door open while you visit the change rooms or toilets. Please remember to take your pool key and valuables with you when visiting the change rooms.

COVER- heating our facility is an expensive exercise and we urgently need your co-operation to ensure the efficient heating of our pool by placing the pool cover on of an evening. If you are using the pool after 6.00pm and there is no one else there when you leave, please place the covers on the pool.

SWIM SQUAD, ACTIVE AFTER SCHOOLS ETC ... Swim Squad and Learn to Swim takes place IN TWO LANES ONLY on: Sundays 2.00—4.00pm, Tuesdays 4.00—6.00pm, Thursdays 4.00pm—6.00pm. The remainder of the pool is available for key holder use during this time. At present we are in the process of having a lane rope made to mark out the two lanes used for these sessions.

Active After School Activities: We hope to commence the Active After Schools Program in the pool on Monday 5th March. Therefore the pool will be unavailable to all key holders between 3.00 and 4.30pm on MONDAY and WEDNESDAY afternoons.

DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT— to date we are happy to say that we have had very few acts of vandalism or damaged caused within the enclosure. However at some stage over the holiday period a filter cover was removed from the bottom of the deep end of the pool and appears to have been used as a Frisbee. There have also been some vandalism in the toilet, with paper being strewn about and the toilet deliberately blocked. We would like to ask all pool users to be responsible in the pool enclosure and report any acts of vandalism or inappropriate behaviour. If you are unable to identify the people involved, please make a note of the time of the occurrence and we may be able to track the offender through the electronic door that registers key holder entry times.

DIVING, BOMBING, TSUNAMIS, ROUGH PLAY—please remember that these activities are not permitted in the pool and form part of your signed pool use agreement. Sadly there have been some instances of careless behaviour which has affected other pool users.

ACCESS TO THE POOL Pool key holders must accompany swimmers to the pools at all times. The key is not transferrable to others. Pool hey holders may bring the children of other pool key holders to the pool, up to a maximum of 5 supervised swimmers. Unauthorised access to the school, school grounds or pool is considered trespassing as per signage at the entrance to the school and by the retaining wall at the pool. As per signage at the pool, please do not allow someone who 'has forgotten their key' unless you can identify them and they appear on the pool key holder list and their key is valid.

LAP SWIMMING it is fantastic to see the large number of lap swimmers using our facility. We would like to remind all pool users to be mindful of others using the pool. As we work though the protocols of operating our new facility we hope to put measures in place to ensure that lap swimmers, general pool users and in the future commercial, community group users are accommodated.

Finally—thank you to our Admin and Cleaning staff who assisted in maintaining the pool, addressing door access, swept the concourse, emptied rubbish bins over the holiday period. Our staff were doing this in their own time and on occasion as pool key holders. Thank you for seeing that our pool users urgent needs were addressed in your own time.

Please remember to watch out for Pool updates, each other in the pool and continue to have an enjoyable swimming season.


