

Welborough Pub

Welborough Hotel

1886 - 2012


One of the most interesting parts of our Tasmanian heritage is the many historical hotels scattered around the State. Whilst some are large buildings with several storeys and have architectural significance, others are more humble, taking on the look of a large house.

One of the most colourful and best known of the hotels in the latter category is the old Welborough Pub, situated beside the Tasman Highway in the little north eastern village of Welborough.

The history of the Welborough Hotel can

be traced back to 1886 when it was called the All Nations Hotel and the town had a population of

some 1200, most of whom were Chinese.



Perhaps the best known of the Chinese was a man by the name of Maa Mon Chin, who was said to be the Mandarin, or Guru of the Chinese people. He not only gave leadership, but supplied his people with work and all the commodities they needed to live and earn their living.

Maa Mon Chin also ran a gambling den, which was most likely the first in Australia. The principal leisure attraction for the Chinese in the North East, however, was a splendid Joss House which incorporated a magnificent altar of the Buddhist God Kuan Ti. The altar was complete with scrolls, elaborate texts and wooden carvings. The Josh House has since been painfully taken apart piece by piece by the Tasmanian Chinese community and rebuilt in the Launceston Museum, for safe keeping

and public display.

Little remains of the once thriving township of Welborough today. The only real reminder of the Chinese presence can be found in a walk through the old cemetery, which is a historical experience in itself.

But the old Welborough Pub has stood the test of time and still stands as a monument to what the town and the area once was. If you visit the old pub today you can be assured of a warm welcome, fine country food and if you have the time to listen, you will come away with enough colourful stories to last a life time.

On Good Friday I happened to watch a documentary on the History channel about the ancient city of Jerusalem. It was fascinating. I can't believe our dopey politicians (all persuasions) continue to sacrifice all these people and countless amounts of money trying to stop the current crop nutters leading the Taliban etc. Perhaps by looking to the future through the very young or even unborn can these ideas of tolerance like in Jerusalem, make headway and in a few generations this much more peaceful doctrine might take hold.


The songs included "O Mio Babbi No Caro", "Mu Lan joins the Army", "Ave Maria" and "Song to the Moon".

DRAMA AND CREATIVE MOVEMENT CLASSES COMING TO ST.MARYS

Assisting Jeanette in class will be Brittany Smith, a young, enthusiastic dance student who recently completed her work experience with Tasmania Dance Company (Tasdance) workshops; where she was subsequently invited by choreographer Malcolm McMillan to dance in his Residency which was part of the 4 day Launceston "Junction Arts Festival". Brittany was also accepted by Tasdance to attend major dance workshops throughout the summer school holidays.

Often the question is asked. What does a drama and creative movement class have to do with my child's development?

The answer is simple. It provides a backdrop of support and development across the whole spectrum of personal and collective learning.

'The brain learns best where it is dynamically involved in exploring, inquiring and analysing. (Gardener 1999).

Drama/creative movement classes support and enhance learning across school curriculum. It develops a young person's social and communication skills and promotes a positive self image. Learning within a safe, relaxed, non-threatening environment stimulates creativity in problem solving and challenges student's perceptions about the world and themselves.

The drama class is a fun place to be! Games and music provide students with shared learning opportunities, whilst encouraging mobility, tolerance, team leadership and team participation.

The drama/creative movement environment consists of formal and informal activities. Formal activities include making props available for acting out stories or enhancing movement/dance themes. Informal activities include improvisations where students create their own dialogue either working as individuals or within a team. By working together students learn to co-operate and collaborate with others.

Participation in drama activities requires self control and discipline which serves in all aspects of life. Of course all students look forward to performing in front of an audience and this will be a major focus once students have settled into the routine of class and have formed a strong working relationship with their fellow class mates. It is expected that parents and friends will be asked to an evening where students will present some of the exercises, improvisations and dance that they have been developing throughout the 10 week term.

So if you feel you have a young thespian in your household or a young person who simply wants something a little different in their after school activities why not come along and really participate in a fun learning experience!!
