

Suicide Awareness Day 2012 and the Eight Hugs a Day "Recommendation"

World Suicide Awareness Day 2012 organised by the World Health Organization and held on 10 September 2012.

World Suicide Awareness Day promotes worldwide commitment and action to prevent suicides. Suicide is the leading cause of death in Australia for men under 44 and women under 34. The most recent Australian data (ABS, Causes of Death, 2009) reports death due to suicide at 2,132. That equates to 6 deaths by suicide a day, or one every four hours. It is however accepted that death by suicide is under reported in Australia. Lifeline provide a 24 hour crisis support centre on 13 11 14.

This brings me to an article I read whilst in Sydney in the Sydney Morning Herald. The article titled "The hormone that makes us good or evil" was published on September 6th 2012 and is available online at:

It reviews the work of American academic Paul Zak and his new book "The Moral Molecule" which examines the hormone oxytocin. Paul Zac finds oyxtocin to be an all embracing "moral molecule", providing a glue that "keeps society together". Towards the end of the article a good tip is given for helping to boost your oxytocin levels, with respect always to personal space, " ... Zac says, we should all be doing more to boost oxytocin in benign ways. He recommends a minimum of eight hugs a day (pets count too)" to maintain mental well being and to boost your oxytocin levels. A simple hug might help a person who is feeling down and blue!

So, don't just reach out to others on Suicide Awareness Day, reach out every day, ask your neighbour R U Okay and smile at passing people, it might be the only human contact that they have that day. A mum told me just this story today of how she has taught her children to smile at passers-by for just this reason. Who will you smile at, or reach out to today?

I would like to personally thank all the animal lovers of our community who made the loss of our beloved one eyed Oliver a little less painful because of their kind sentiments. Thank you.



of the crafts made by our talented members.


The Guild meets on the last Saturday of every month at 2pm in the old railway goods shed situated behind the Railway Station complex.



650 ORIENTEERS CONVERGING ON TASMANIA

650 Orienteers from across Australia and New Zealand will be converging on Tasmania later this week for the Australian Orienteering Championships Carnival which commences on Saturday 22 September 2012.

Carnival Director Greg Hawthorne said yesterday that the championships are bringing 650 competitors, together with family members and teachers, for the 9 Day carnival which includes the Australian Schools Orienteering Championships.

The first event, the Australian Middle Distance Orienteering Championships will be held just outside St Helens on Saturday. The following Friday will see the Sprint Distance Championships in Bicheno with the Long Distance Championships back in St Helens on Saturday. Additional events will be the Tasmanian Long Distance Championships and the Australian Orienteering Relay Championships.

The Australian Schools Orienteering Championships will be held at Royal George near Avoca in the Fingal Valley on Tuesday 25 and Wednesday 26 September.

The Tasmanian schools team won the competition last year in NSW and is looking for a good finish at this years event. Coach Mike Dowling said that this year's team is strong with many of last year's competitors running again. "In particular we are looking for a great result from Launceston competitor Brodie Nankervis" said Mr Dowling "as he has just returned from a very successful performance at the Junior World Championships in Slovakia".

In the senior ranks all eyes will be on current Australian top ranked Tasmanian orienteer Grace Crane who will be trying to repeat her winning form in the Easter 3 Days carnival in Queensland earlier this year and take out the women's elite competition. Other Tasmanians likely to place in the age classes are Bernard Walker in men's 50, David Marshall in men's 60 and Sue Hancock in women's 45.

The oldest competitor in the carnival is Tasmanian Joyce Jones who will be competing in the womens 85+ class.



The Say Cagerattler

At the moment there is a push on for better, more accurate labelling of Australian made items. According to a report I listened to and saw recently, labelling laws are somewhat ambiguous to say the least.. Products especially affected are food items.

It seems that where a product is packaged, may be nowhere near where it is harvested, even in a different country altogether and legislation is hoped to be invoked to make this clearer to the consumer. Perhaps this would let buyers make better decisions, especially in regard to our struggling farmers and the competition they face from overseas markets. So bad has it now gotten in Tasmania with our iconic apples ,that this year for the first time since 1870, yes 142 years, that we can't export our apples other than to mainland markets because we just can't compete price wise due to much cheaper apples flooding the world markets. That is so sad. Aren't we supposed to be the Apple Isle? One apple farmer being interviewed said that only really special first grade apples can be sold for eating and the rest end up in tins or apple juice, where there is still a market locally, and he also said the markets today are only between 30-40% of their heydays of the 1960s.

When are successive governments of ALL persuasions going to start thinking of really looking after our primary producers before it's all too late and we lose them. Abattoirs closing down all over the place, prime farmland going into trees, overseas products at a fraction of the price flooding our markets and of course inaccurate labelling even affects consumers making decisions on whether they are buying Australian or not. It's about time we put our foot down. Perhaps it would be good if we fully understood the ramifications of a Free Trade Agreement with some of the countries we do business with. Perhaps we also need to make hard decisions, some of these trading partner countries leave a lot to be desired when it comes to fair pay for their workers, decent return for effort and humanitarian reasons. Maybe we should only trade with countries that truly meet certain standards in return for our considerable resources wealth, pretty much our only real bargaining chip lets just say.

So many of our day to day products aren't, and haven't been for a while, manufactured in Australia, even though they probably could be in some instances. Our local car industry is on it's knees with imported vehicles and components increasing all the time. Where does it all stop? In global terms we are travelling pretty well, mainly again due to massive wealth in the resources sector but one day this will not be the case and perhaps we should be starting to think beyond now, and look at a couple of generations down the track. The first step might come from being able to read a label on a can of peas and know exactly where it comes from.

Landcare Conference 2012

I was recently honoured to receive a grant from Natural Resources Management to fund my attendance at the National Landcare conference for 2012. The Landcare conference was held from 3-5 September 2012 at the Sydney Convention and Exhibition Centre at Darling Harbour. The conference brought together individual Landcarers, Landcare and community groups, regional bodies, natural resources management (NRM) practitioners, international Landcare members and Australian Government representatives.

The conference theme was 'Landcare - the future in our hands' and focussed on the growing interest and concern within Australia regarding sustainable living and food security. The conference examined how the Landcare community, being at the forefront of land management in Australia, could help to ensure that Australia can move confidently towards a smart and resilient agricultural and environmental future.

Day one involved a field trip and I went on a trip around Sydney Harbour combined with a walk from Bradleys Head to the Taronga Zoo wharf. This field trip looked at the coastal environment and the work being done on the Harbour islands since they have been handed back to the New South Wales National Parks - Goat Island was of particular interest. The Sydney Harbour National Park now protects a number of islands and foreshore areas and it was interesting to see how some Landcare groups

accessed the islands by kayak to undertake weeding and rehabilitation work.

Days two and three involved plenary sessions, workshops and smaller discussion groups. There were some incredible and inspiring speakers, one of the highlights for me was Dr David Suzuki who said "Food was once very much alive, the vast bulk has come from the soil. Surely, the soil quality is what we should be looking after. We destroy clean air, water and soil, and we treat the earth as a garbage can for toxic materials. Photosynthesis is vital, capturing sunlight and thereby making life possible. It is the web of living things around the earth that maintain the health of the systems of air water soil sunlight and biodiversity; they are sacred."


Other inspirational speakers included Tim Flannery, Mia Freedman and Peter FitzSimons. The winners of the 2012 National Landcare Awards were announced at a gala awards dinner in the Convention Centre on the Tuesday evening - the People's Choice Award was awarded to Youngtown Primary School in Tasmania. This is a publicly voted for category so for a small rural Tassie school to win was quite a feat! The students have been working in conjunction with the residents at the Glenara Lakes Retirement Village to transform two man- made lakes in what was once just a paddock, to a place now brimming with native plants and wildlife. They have been encouraging the breeding of the endangered green and gold frog. I came back to St Marys inspired and ready to start propagating again. Facelift for St. Marys Industrial Heritage Building

In 2004, Ian and Rita Summers purchased an old garage in St. Marys' Main Street and converted the front half into a gallery and studio, which is operated by Rita. The back half became lan's domain, and houses a number of classic cars in various stages of restoration, as well as many other treasures.

Originally known as Brown's Garage, and later as Spilsbury's Garage, parts of the building date back to the 1920's. In fact, there are actually two buildings: The earlier structure, which is just behind what is now the gallery, was originally a blacksmith's shop. During the 1940's it was obscured by a new service station, built directly in front of it.

The ability of people to make do on a shoestring budget is evident everywhere. The iron on the roof still had the holes in it from wherever it had been used previously, and recycled mining pipe and track lines form posts and trusses in what is now the gallery interior and exterior.

lan replaced the roof on the front building in 2004, and added a wall at the front where the cars used to drive in off the street.

He also converted the office and parts storeroom into one large space - this is now the studio area. The original hatchway in the parts storeroom was retained, as were the worn thresholds into the studio and the bathroom. The original doors are an additional feature, as well as two other restored doors which were added during the conversion.

The original timber office floor was also restored. It took lan two days of work with a heat gun and scraper to remove the worn brown linoleum on what is a relatively small space. It had been stuck down with an adhesive that could rival any super glue! Rita asked him not to over-restore the floorboards, so that they would still retain the patina of years of use. The old storeroom, which had a concrete floor on a lower level, was raised and refloored with timber joists, compressed fibre board, and a slate-look vinyl.

Ian also meticulously sealed and painted the original concrete floor in the gallery, lying down for hours with a paintbrush to simulate lines of 'mortar' to make it look like terracotta tiles.

It is 7 years since this work was done, and it was time for a facelift!

The ceiling in the gallery has now been replastered, and a decision was made to repaint both the gallery and the studio.


Of course, everything had to be moved! It was a lot of work emptying everything out, but Rita and Ian had great fun re-organising and re-arranging everything to compliment the new decor.

Maternity Services have arrived on The East Coast of Tasmania

An Antenatal Clinic and Maternity Services have been developed through a funded program from the Medical Specialist Outreach Assistance Program—Maternity Services based in St Marys and St Helens.

We are providing the service aiming to meet needs of pregnant women on the East Coast through a local and accessible clinic where everyone is welcome. We do note that women may choose to continue to access services at the Launceston General Hospital Antenatal Clinic.

Services include General Practitioner Obstetrician, Midwifery Antenatal Clinic, Physiotherapy, and Social Worker support.

The Midwifery Clinic will provide antenatal care to women with low risk pregnancies. Women with high risk pregnancies will continue to need to have their care provided by the Launceston General Hospital Antenatal Clinic.

Once linked with the Midwifery clinic, referrals will be made with the Obstetrics General Practitioner, Physiotherapist, and Social Worker where required or requested.

Appointments can be made by contacting either St Marys Community Health

Centre or St Helens District Hospital. If you have only found out recently that you are pregnant, initial appointments can be booked after referral to the service by your General Practitioner.

The Midwifery Antenatal Clinic will occur every Wednesday, week about at St Marys Community Health Centre and St Helens Child and Family Centre. Obstetrics General Practitioner appointments will be available every 6 to 8 weeks by appointment. Appointments with the Physiotherapist and Social Worker can occur at either St Marys Community Health Centre or St Helens District Hospital after referral by appointment.

During your pregnancy the service will also introduce you to the Child and Family Health Nurse who will be available to provide support to you following the birth of your baby.

The service does not provide home visits or intrapartum care. Intrapartum care will continue to be delivered by the Launceston General Hospital and women are to present there when in labour.

We look forward to meeting you and supporting you throughout your pregnancy.
