Tasmanian Forest Agreement would protect 500 jobs

Opponents of the Tasmanian Forest Agreement have been urged to take heed of the findings of a new socioeconomic impact report which shows the historic deal would save more than 500 jobs.

The Premier, Lara Giddings, said the report confirmed the TFA was the best way to respond to market-driven challenges in the forest industry.

"This report confirms what we have been saying since the very start of this process - the Tasmanian Forest Agreement will protect jobs in the forest industry," Ms Giddings said. "It portrays a stark choice. If the deal is scrapped, as advocated by the Liberal Party, it is estimated that at least 678 direct jobs could be lost or 1900 when combined with indirect jobs. In contrast, the initial transition to a sustainable industry would result in 142 job losses, which will be mitigated by programs such as the saw-log buy-back and contractor assistance packages. That means over 500 jobs direct could be saved if the deal is implemented."

"This report proves, once and for all, that the head in the sand approach being taken by Will Hodgman is akin to economic vandalism that would devastate regional communities."

"You simply can't trust Will Hodgman when he claims tearing up the TFA would solve the challenges in the forest industry. Only the State Government has a plan to secure a long term future for the forest industry and create jobs and opportunities for Tasmanians."

Ms Giddings urged the Legislative Council to take heed of the compelling evidence and make a decision on the legislation when Parliament returns in March.

"It has now been over two months since Parliament debated this legislation and I believe there has been more than enough time to make a decision."

Deputy Premier and Minister for Energy and Resources, Bryan Green said the report shows that the forest industry could not afford for the conflict and uncertainty to continue.


"The number of jobs in the Tasmanian forestry industry halved between 2006 and 2011 in response to global market forces," Mr Green said.

"If we try to preserve the status quo that trend will continue and the forestry industry will die.

"It is time for Will Hodgman and the Liberal Party to wake up, stop lying to the Tasmanian people that they can magically make things go back to the way they were, and start supporting the forest industry.

"If the Liberals really care about people and jobs they will now support the agreement. "This is too important to continue to play politics with people and jobs."



As a frequent visitor to the St Helens "Lawn" Cemetery I am bemused, saddened, frustrated and aggrieved at the condition of the site for which Break O'Day Council is responsible. To describe part of the site as a Lawn Cemetery requires a considerable stretch of a fertile imagination.

Surely an organisation such as Break O'Day Council has a set of service levels, i.e. standards, pertaining to the work their employees perform at the cemetery. These standards, if they in fact exist, would in my opinion not be met by the current standard of work being performed or they are inadequate.

Many graves have sunk, a natural phenomenon, and have not been filled to a level consistent with the height of the surrounding area. This has been the case for many months. As a consequence the act of mowing scalps the higher graves leaving a bare surface which at best is unsightly and gives the grass no opportunity to grow. The edges around the concreted areas are never trimmed consequently the grass grows over the concrete.

During a mowing operation I witnessed recently the mower operator did not bother to inspect and clean the area prior to commencing mowing. This resulted in "confetti", parts of flowers and paper, being strewn across the grass and an unsightly mess left behind. It is very poor and unsafe practice to mow any area without first performing an inspection of the area.

The circumstances I have mentioned lead me to wonder if the organisation has proper training and supervision in place as it is obvious there are failings in both these areas. All parties, those who have passed away, the bereaved families, friends and the community deserve a better outcome than that which is currently being delivered by Break O'Day Council and its employees. 



- knitted teddy bears





How much do you KNOW OR CARE?

Plastic is such a useful material. Oldies, like me, remember a time when we didn't have plastic, we wrapped sandwiches in greaseproof paper, transported food to friends in casserole dishes or saucepans. If the container didn't have a lid an old plate was used, tied tightly with a tea towel.

To-day we receive plastic in one form or another with almost every purchase we make. Where does it go when we have finished with it? It is too easy to put it in the rubbish and out of our minds.

Do you know that every bit of plastic ever made is still around SOMEWHERE in our globe? It is true that biodegradable plastic bags are now being made and these break into tiny pieces. BUT! Those tiny pieces are now likely to get into OUR food chain and into OUR bodies. Already fish and sea birds are eating tiny pieces of plastic. In America many people already have plastic ingested into their bodies. 
One small step we can take is to ban plastic bags in the Break O Day Municipality. Coles Bay was a leader in this.





The Say By Cagerattler

The other night I was scrolling through YouTube looking for some historic Tasmanian fishing videos and discovered trout fishing footage that had been posted - lots of it in fact. I had a look at a few but ended up quite depressed about the subject. Why you might ask? So many great images of some of our iconic places and others I've never heard of, many in through the remote western region. They were fantastic and featured in fishing shows as well. One or two fly fishing videos also appeared being filmed on the North and South Esk and an old one on the Break O'Day..

The Break O'Day Rivulet used to be an incredible trout venue. I know, because as a kid and into my 20s I used to fish it often. Admittedly I didn't fly fish but used worms, grasshoppers and wattle grubs, selta's and wobblers. It was very, very common to tackle three to four pounders and you'd be really surprised if you didn't catch at least a two pounder nearly every time. In those days in the mid to late 1970s we would take home our fish before the days of catch and release.

I recall fishing near Legge's one hot morning with a good friend and each catching a trout four plus pounds within five minutes and another time when a family member caught two monsters at Harefield. It was expected in those days. Sadly no more.

I rang one of our most respected local fly fishermen for this article, Rick Lohrey, to ask how things sat and he gave me some more contemporary insight that I appreciated very much.

Rick mentioned that the Inland Fisheries had just recently concluded a five year re stocking program for the Break O'Day and had released 30,000 fingerlings in that time. He had volunteered his assistance as part of this and would be happy to continue to help Inland Fisheries whenever he can. It's obvious that without genuine local knowledge it would be very difficult to achieve much at all in this regard.

Unfortunately analysis had so far determined that this was yet to be as successful as it might be at this stage. Rick has been exclusively a catch and release fisherman now for at least a quarter of a century but knows that one part of the complex problem is that many others don't do that. He strongly believes this would help a lot because, as he described, not as many adult fish can then spawn as they need to - allowing a greater chance of natural restocking. Also there are some not yet officially endorsed educated evaluations that work carried out to straighten the rivulets, fortifying banks and remove trees. Maybe even the odd unsatisfactory substances released into the Break O Day are contributing toward this otherwise great little river falling from grace as a fishery.

It seems that the environmental impact on the wild trout needed to be seriously evaluated much sooner whilst all sorts of changes were being made on the rivulet .

The rivulet now seems to silt up badly and without claiming to be an expert this must affect the habitat of the fish. Anyone who is at least 30 years old will remember large numbers of so called 'tame trout' that congregated around the town bridge and would go into a frenzy when fed bread crumbs bought at the bakery. It was a tourist attraction and gave a pretty fair indication of a healthy rivulet when you saw the sheer size of many of them. The water was somewhat deeper also and substantial overhang of trees and undergrowth provided a pretty decent diet of bugs and insects for the fish...it was terrific.

Maybe it's time to ask our current local government and state government representatives to have a look at this situation. Rick mentioned he recalls reading a review of our local fishery from the 1980s that described the Break O'Day Rivulet as perhaps the best dry fly river in the Southern Hemisphere. That's only a generation and a bit ago. Despite monumental efforts to rehabilitate and protect our Rivulet from the departure of wild brown trout in the ensuing decades, not least Inland Fisheries and blokes like Rick, we need the powers that be to start making decisions and restoration to stop us from losing all our trout, that was once an iconic drawcard to the area. Rick also mentioned that he fishes in the USA (mostly Montana) and things like this would never be allowed to happen there. I wonder can we learn from them on such

For the record I am now no longer a trout fisherman, no-one asked me to write this article but I know those who enjoy the gentle, skilful sport of fly fishing (including blokes like Rick who have already contributed so much to help out) would appreciate some consideration to help re-establish the Break O'Day as a genuine wild brown fishery of note. Who knows, maybe one day a Fly fishing club of enthusiasts?

I'd like to thank Rick for his help at such short notice - it was much appreciated.

DEFENCE VC REPORT FLAWED AND SHOULD BE SET ASIDE

'FIGHT ON' FOR TEDDY SHEEAN VC

Thursday 7 March 2013

The Defence Tribunal Report into a possible Victoria Cross for 13 Australian men was flawed, should be set aside and the fight should go on for appropriate recognition, especially for ordinary seaman Teddy Sheean. Former Tasmanian Senator Guy Barnett who was instrumental in the establishment of the Defence Honours and Awards Appeals Tribunal inquiry into unresolved recognition for past acts of naval and military gallantry and valour in April 2011 said the Tribunal followed their own "Guidelines" rather than the Terms of Reference given by the Government.

"Nobody would be granted a VC or any other award under these self-imposed guidelines. The Terms of Reference were disregarded because the Tribunal had a pre-determined outcome. They wanted no change. These so-called guidelines have sadly coloured the entire report meaning that compelling evidence and arguments for a VC or even an upgrade to the original award have been dismissed altogether."

"Following careful review of the Report (454 pages) it is clear the Inquiry was predetermined, and a whitewash bordering on a charade. Rather than determining if the 13 Australians under consideration for a Victoria Cross or another bravery award were deserving, the Tribunal imposed a higher burden of proof including maladministration in the original nomination process. Why should there be a requirement to prove the nomination process was done illegally or there was maladministration? This is patently wrong, "he said.

"The Government should set aside the report and ensure these 13 courageous Australians are considered on their merits. The fight must go on. The Tribunal's self-imposed "Guidelines" (p5 and chapter 8.48) state:

If due process had been followed, if there was no maladministration, and if there is no new evidence, then the original decision should remain unchanged.

There are holes in this report. "

Ordinary Seaman Teddy Sheean

"The Tribunal also got it wrong when it came to ordinary seaman Teddy Sheean. The Tribunal stated 'Sheean's actions displayed conspicuous gallantry but did not reach the particularly high standard required for recommendation for a VC.' This is an incredulous statement in light of the facts and when comparing Teddy Sheean's acts of bravery with those of other VC recipients. This statement is insulting to the family of Teddy Sheean and should be expunged from the report. The Tribunal have concluded his 'conspicuous bravery' was not brave enough.

The Tribunal also stated regarding the Sheean nomination process '...there was not sufficient evidence that there was a manifest injustice...' Well how much evidence was there of 'manifest injustice'?

The Tribunal has not taken into account some of the key arguments in support of a VC for Teddy Sheean, being:

The views of key independent witnesses to the bravery of Teddy Sheean have not been adequately taken into account. At least four eye witnesses spoke of Teddy Sheean's gallantry

☐ Sheean's nomination was considered by the British Admiralty and his actions were strikingly similar to that of British Leading Seaman Jack Mantle who was awarded a VC

☐ The recommendation for an award by Captain Richards was inadequate as he did not interview survivors who witnessed Sheean's actions and for other reasons

The Government and the Navy wanted a cover-up as further exposure of Japanese success may have caused panic in the southern states of Australia

If the Tribunal agreed Sheean displayed 'conspicuous gallantry' why did they not, at the very least, award the Star of Gallantry? I would be surprised if the Tribunal Report was tabled in Cabinet. Because if it was, the Government should have noticed that the Tribunal followed their self—imposed Guidelines rather than the Terms of Reference. Simply, the Tribunal's mind was made up from the beginning that no VC or upgrade award would be granted to protect the 'integrity' of the Awards system. This is not good enough.

Why did the Government establish the inquiry process in the first place, at my urging, if they were not willing to accept these possible outcomes?" Mr Barnett concluded.

Fight On

The Sheean family friends and supporters are committed to fight on.

"We will be writing to the Prime Minister asking that the Report be set aside and asking that they ensure the 13 brave Australians nominated are reviewed on their merits. We will be asking for special attention be given to Teddy Sheean as we believe and know he deserves a VC, "said Mr Garry Ivory.

"We will also be writing to the Opposition Leader Tony Abbott asking that if in government they also set it aside and ensure a proper review.

Andrew Nikolic, retired Brigadier and liberal candidate for Bass, has been a tireless supporter for this campaign to recognise Teddy Sheean. Together with Guy Barnett their support is really appreciated.

We will not give up. We will fight on." Mr Ivory concluded.


Ordinary Seaman Teddy Sheean- a selfless act

Ordinary Seaman Teddy Sheean was born in Lower Barrington, Tasmania on 28 December 1923. His family soon moved to Latrobe and he was educated at the local Catholic school and worked as a farm labourer until he enlisted in the Royal Australian Naval Reserve at 17 years.

.In June 1942 he was posted to the HMAS Armidale as an Oerlikon anti-aircraft gun loader.

The Japanese were moving south ferocious and fast and on 1 December 1942 the Armidale, then in the Timor sea just north of Australia, came under repeated attack by at least 13 Japanese aircraft. By 3.15pm the *Armidale* had been struck by two aerial torpedoes and

began to sink, an event that would take less than 5 minutes. Lieutenant Commander David Richards ordered the ship to be abandoned. Out of the 149 on board, only 49 would be rescued from the water.



As the ship was sinking, and the survivors in the water tried to board life-rafts, the Japanese aircraft continued to strafe the men in the water. Ordinary Seaman Sheean possibly already wounded, and seeing his mates in distress and being shot at, returned to his Oerlikon gun, strapped himself in, and began firing at the

Japanese aircraft and attracting enemy fire. He reportedly shot down at least one Japanese Zero in his efforts.

Witnesses report that tracer fire could still be seen leaving the gun after she sunk below the waves. Sheean would have known his fate when he returned to his gun but in an act of conspicuous bravery offered up his life for his mates and his country. He was not yet 19 years.

)There is a well-known painting at the Australian War Memorial which commemorates this incident and a submarine named in his honour.)


