Falmouth Field Day

On Sunday the 17th June the St Patricks Head & Esk Valley Historical Society once again held a successful field day. This time it was a walk and historical study around the township of Falmouth.

Although it was a rather cold June day, some twenty people turned out to wander around the town and listen to local historian, Tim McManus, give a comprehensive insight into the history of what was the first settlement on the east coast of Tasmania.

After almost fifty years of researching the area and compiling his beautifully written and illustrated book "Thanks to Providence", nobody has a better knowledge of Falmouth, its surrounds and the people who have lived in the area, than Tim.


All those in the group, included the half dozen children, were captivated by Tim as he led us around the town stopping at various spots to point out historical landmarks and explain their significance. Tim covered the town's history from its Aboriginal heritage, where he showed the group middens and ancient stone tools, to the supposed sighting of St Patricks Head by Abel Tasman in 1642 and the naming of the mountain by Tobias Furneaux on St Patrick's Day 1773. He told the group about Captain James Kelly, who was the first recorded European to land near Falmouth in 1816. The next step in the history of Falmouth was the granting of land in the area to John Henderson and William Steel, who settled on their grants in the 1820s.

As we moved around the town, Tim pointed out a number of old buildings which date back to the 1840s and explained how one old settler could shoot swan on Henderson Lagoon, some two hundred metres away, from his attic window. It was said he would lean out of the window and rest his rifle on the roof to get a steadier aim.

At the old cemetery, which is no longer in use, Tim talked about the families who had made a mark in Falmouth's history. They included Hendersons, Steels, Thompsons, Thorolds, Treloggens, Singlines, McIntyres, Lohreys and Schiers.

From what was a thriving community in the 1800s, with hotels, stores, blacksmiths and the like, Falmouth is now a quiet seaside hamlet and whilst there is still a reminder of its history here and there, the majority of the buildings are now quite modern. This gives a charming old and new character to the town, but with so much vacant land for sale, one would suspect the new will eventually take over. However, thanks to people like Tim McManus the wonderful history of the town and its people is well documented and will remain forever.

Thanks to the Unit Committee for their much appreciated work on supplying morning tea for the cadets, staff, family, friends and guests and the committee's support throughout the year.





The Say Cagerattler

I'm beginning to think our Governments need to approach unemployment in a totally different way. Just about every week in just about every industry there is news of cut backs, job security issues, outright closures of businesses or government departments and the like. When does this reach critical mass? It will one day.

What do people do when they suddenly, usually through no fault of their own, find themselves unemployed or with much reduced hours. No wonder less and less can take on big mortgages and debt and hence the economy suffers in retail and manufacturing. These people can't be sure of their job and the risk of major debt is very real.

No-one has an easy answer but it's unlikely that things are going to be hugely better in the short term. Australia is doing pretty well in global terms, as my friend in the USA has previously mentioned and as I did a few issues ago on the back of that but that shouldn't deter us from making things better still. It's in every one's interest surely.

As we know there are businesses struggling, barely surviving in every community and not necessarily being able to expand or try new ideas. Some others might be able to do better with more hands-on help perhaps, especially in regard to longer hours or being able to train an assistant. I fully realise that this is a simplistic concept but what if the growing or stagnant unemployment lines could be improved by our government offering worthwhile incentives, so long as the business or project meets certain sustainability criteria of course, to businesses, community groups, individuals with a vision for a new venture and so on. It has been done or thought of before to degrees but has never really taken off. I recall reading once about what the USA did after the Great Depression in the early 1930s. The called it "The New Deal" and they created a brand new economy with huge incentives which in turn lifted that country out of stagnation again. Of course the world is a different place now, different trading partners, different lifestyles, different threats but the concept of it all must be good.

During the GFC of recent times the Government did a pretty good job in some degree with the stimulus package but it was mostly only infrastructure project I think.

Why not do this across the services industries, agriculture, aged care by way of offering sustained and guaranteed packages if there was a proven viability for that service or opportunity.

Similarly when "retraining" or "reclassified" is mentioned, it has to be in practical and sensible areas that make the most of that person's/peoples skills, giving the trainee a real chance of succeeding and not just a get out chance for the company. Perhaps a tougher approach to access to unemployment benefits needs to be considered also for the few who milk the system, costing millions each year... Tough love I think it's called.

It has to be a bi-partisan approach across the whole country by all political parties and departments and by lot's of different bodies who deal with people facing life without decent job prospects. Unfortunately you'd need to be an eternal optimist to think this "Think Tank" might ever happen as politics conspires bi-partisan as a dirty phrase but surely we can dream that work/security matters are something to aspire to ,not dream about. Heaven help us all if we become an ever increasing welfare country. That's no good for any-one is it?

Helping Tasmanian businesses grow

A series of workshops aimed at supporting Tasmanian businesses continue to roll out around the state with a seminar aimed at helping business operators cut their power costs offered in Hobart last week.

The first Energy Ready Workshop was the first workshop under the Business Ready program to help businesses manage their power costs and was officially launched by the Parliamentary Secretary for Small Business, Rebecca White.

Ms White was joined at the launch by David Kay, co-owner of the Richmond Bakery, who took part in the workshop.

"Through the actions of the Small Business Strategy, we have identified ways we can offer practical advice and assistance to small business operators, and help them overcome the challenges they're facing," she said.

"One of the areas identified by business operators through the Small Business Strategy consultation process was the difficulty in managing energy costs, and through this first workshop, we will look at identifying where businesses use their energy, and how they can cut their power costs.

"Businesses can also learn more about what is happening in the state's energy market, look at equipment, machinery and practices that can reduce their energy bill and develop a long-term strategy to reduce energy usage."

Ms White said the Small Business Strategy had identified six different areas where business operators would like assistance to improve their operations. Further workshops will cover a range of other areas, including:


- Successfully marketing products and services;

Break O'Day Council Finances A Sustainability Risk??

Management Comments of Financial Sustainability should also have been reported.

While "Break O'Day Finances a Sustainability Risk" make a great headline, the full report provides more balanced information.

The financial unsustainability relates to operating deficits which, as per the management comments in the audit report, Council has been addressing. All the angst that Council and our community has gone through, a thorough organisational review and subsequent voluntary and involuntary redundancies, has been to address this very problem.

The risk of governance unsustainability relates to the lack of an audit committee and asset management and long term financial management planning. Council's are not required to have audit committees and, regardless of this, Council recently workshopped the costs and benefits of an audit committee. Given our financial circumstances and the whole of Council regularly workshopping financial issues, Council decided that the costs outweighed the benefits at this stage. Council are currently having the discussion about which way to proceed and which options best suits our Council's needs.

Break O'Day municipality was impacted by 4 separate flood events which were declared under the Australian Government's Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (NDRRA) with over \$5M damage to Council infrastructure during the period of the Audit Report. It needs to be clear that the Municipality sustained a higher than expected deficit due to the extent of the flood damage and the arrangements in place for Council to be in a position to claim against the NDRRA for the repairs to the infrastructure damaged within the Municipality.

I think it speaks volumes for the sustainability of our municipality as we as a Council are constantly striving to keep this Municipality in a viable and sustainable financial situation.





Autumn / Winter is a great time for pruning and gleaning interesting and productive materials for basket making.

Some materials may be used fresh, some dried and some both!

Materials to dry:

Red Hot Pokers, montbretia, watsonia, iris, gladioli, ginger, cane and day lilies, New Zealand flax, mint, bull rush.

Tie the material by the tips in bundles and hang up to dry - not in direct sunlight. Drying time will vary -3 weeks or more. For storage, wrap in bundles of dry newspaper.

To prepare for use: - the day before soak in water for 5-10 min then wrap in old dry towels or sheets of dry newspaper and leave overnight. Only wet enough for one days use.

Materials to Bring Fresh:

Willows, dogwood, fruit tree prunings, suckers, blackberry, broom, cotoneaster. Cordyline (cabbage tree palm) picked up off the ground and soaked overnight.

Vines: - if not used green maybe coiled and stored in a dry place away from direct sun. Try – jasmine, ivy, wisteria, hardenbergia, honeysuckle, Virginia creeper, periwinkle, clematis, grape, muehlenbeckia, briar rose, and kennedia.

To Prepare for use: - soak overnight in water

Be inventive!!! - Sweet corn leaves and husks, bark and fibres from trees, flower stalks of agapanthus, pokers and iris. Lavender, pine needles, seaweed, gum nuts and seed pods.

For the workshop:

Comfortable working clothes, apron, materials, sharp secateurs, pliers, pen & paper, strong clothes pegs x 12, large darning or bag needles, string & strong thread, old towels (wetting and wiping)

If you can collect large quantities of one material bring it and swap with others. Don't forget your imagination! We'll have some fun constructing several different baskets.
