This will extend its useful period in the first and third terms.

SPORT.

FISHING NEWS.

The last fortnight has been one of extreme contrast in the fishing world on the East Coast. Surf anglers have been spending hours on the beach without any sign of fish - even the surf crabs appear to be on strike. Beaches are shallow and flat due to continuous Easterly weather and fish have just disappeared.
