WHAT IS AUSTCARE ?

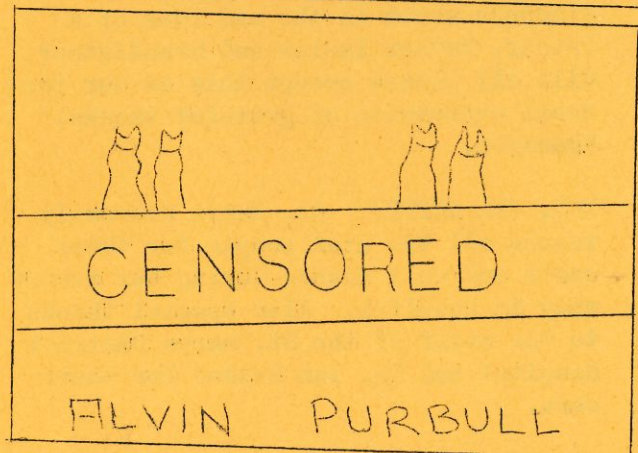
Austcare stands for "Australians Care for Refugees." Austcare was formed in 1967 by the major voluntary aid bodies working in Australia to aid the world's refugees. In this way the member organisations have created a united effort for a common cause, providing a single point of focus for the Australian community's concern for refugees.

WHAT is Austcare doing to aid the world's Refugees ?

Austcare has distributed over \$5 million to its member organisations for programmes of relief, resettlement and rehabilitation of refugees in all parts of the world. In 1975, a special allocation of \$50,000 was given to provide for emergency food and medical relief for thousands of refugees in Timor. Since the cessation of hostilities in Vietnam Austcare has been involved in a vast programme to assist displaced persons as a result of this conflict. Austcare is involved in Bangladesh, throughout Africa, and anywhere else where there is a need. Last year alone Austcare was working in over 25 countries all over the world.

WHAT IS FREEDOM FROM HUNGER CAMPAIGN.

This is a programme for the assistance of the hungry. This

NATIONAL STAMP WEEK Sept. 27 - 1st.

A GREAT TIME TO GET STUCK INTO STAMPS.

National stamp week serves to remind us all of this great hobby of stamp collecting and the need to encourage people, especially young people, to collect stamps, both for pleasure and profit. It is a fact that some stamps do not lose their value, and a quick look at current prices lists will indicate that, indeed, the value of stamps multiply many times, sometimes in very short periods of time. People who have saved stamps and have put them aside over the years would be shocked at the value of their collections at present value. As our part in one promotion of National Stamp Week, this office will be adopting the following program:-

1. SCHOOL LECTURE: A lecture will be given at the District School on Monday 27th Sept. beginning at 1 pm. All interested school children are most welcome at this lecture. Any questions you may have will be answered during the lecture. Bring your collections along- discuss your problems.

2. COMPETITION : A special stamp week has been arranged for both Junior (under 12 on 1st Oct.76) and senior 12 - 16 years). Entry forms will be available at the school during stamp week and also at the Post Office. All the answers to the questions can be located by viewing the display posters at the Post Office. Good prizes will be given to the winning entries.

3. STAMP DISPLAY : During the week, various stamps will be displayed at the Post Office. Everyone is invited to view these stamps and any questions will be answered by my staff.

His experience as a fly fisherman enabled President Gif Gadsby to take the honours with Geddes Luck second. It is rumoured that "Ferdie" is cutting one of his rods in half and getting lessons from Gif.

Next event will be held at Four Mile on 17th October with distance casting from 11am. to noon and then surf contest until 4 p.m. St. Helens Surf Angling Club will hold a surf contest at Dianna's Basin from noon to 5.30 pm. on 3rd October.

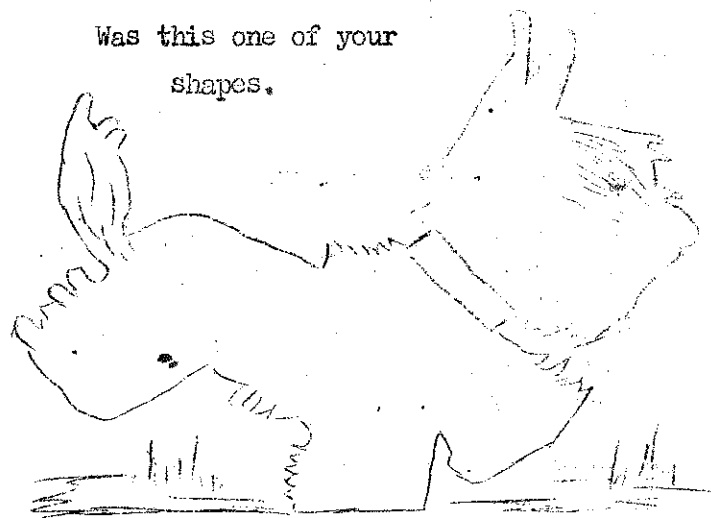

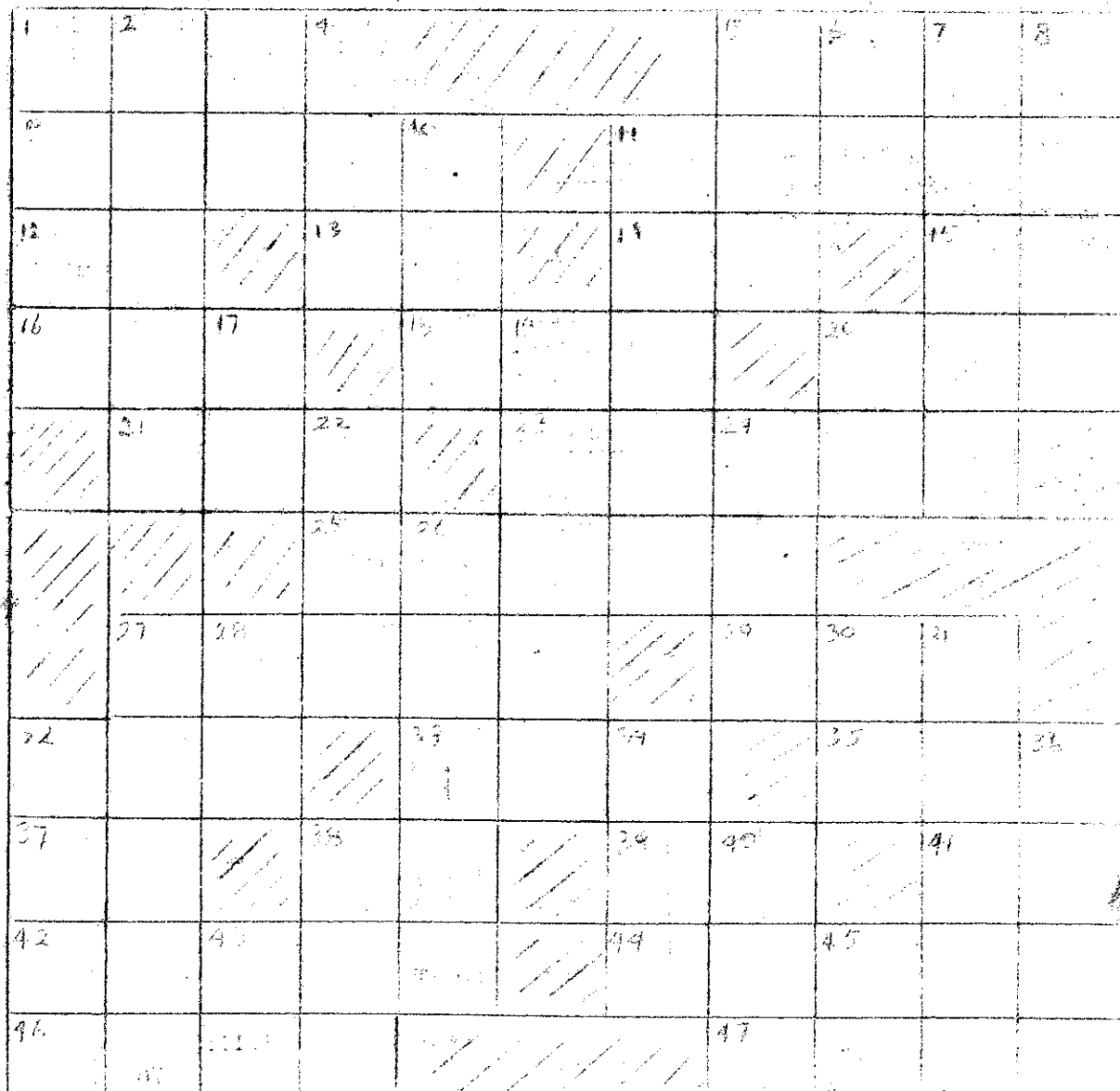
