WHAT IS AUSTCARE ?


Austcare stands for "Australians Care for Refugees." Austcare was formed in 1967 by the major avoluntary aid bodies working in Australia to aid the world's refugees. In this way the member organisations have created a united effort for a common cause, providing a single point of focus for the Australian community's concern for refugees.

WHAT is Austrace doing to aid the world's Refugees ?

Austcare has distrubuted over \$5 million to its member organisations for programms of relief, resettlement and rehabilitation of refugees in all parts of the world. In 1975, a special allocation of \$50,000 was given to provide for emergency food and medical relief for thousands of refugees in Timor. Since the essation of hostilities in Vietnam Austcare has been involved in a vast programme to assist displaced persons as a result of this conflict. Austcare is involved in Bangladesh, throughout Africa, and anywhere else where there is a need. Last year alone Austcare was working in over 25 countries all over the world.
