

EDITORIAL

GARDEN NOTES - Companion Plants

Have you tried companion planting as a control for pests in your garden? This is quite exciting and it is effective, after you have done everything possible to provide healthy soil for your plants you may still have insect problems. Plants growing together in the small space of a garden may interact with each other, a tall species will help to shelter a smaller species, one species has a deep root system this loosens the soil to a greater depth for shorter roots and some plants have odour's or juices which are insect-repelling or attracting substances. These will directly influence the growth of other plants or alter the population of micro-organisms that live in the soil, or be effective in the crowded world of animals crawling and flying in and around the roots, leaves and blossoms.



MR. & MRS. PAT BURT of Mangana have left for an exciting tour of South Australia.


All residents of Mangana are sorry to hear Mr. & Mrs. Chesshire are leaving to live in Launceston. All their friends wish them well.






