
### EDITORIAL

#### LENT AND HEALTH

With the commencement of Lent we feel that Christmas is barely over before Easter is here. Easter Sunday always comes first full moon after 21st March. Therefore the 22nd March is the earliest date for Easter and the 25th of April the Latest date.

Lent was so called after the lenghtening of the days heralding the approach of Spring. It begins with Ash Wednesday and ends at Easter. The name Ash Wednesday was derived from the custom of sprinkling ashes on the forehead of penitents on that day. Christians all over the world celebrate this this 40 day period of Lent in commemoration of Jesus fasting in the wilderness. They use it as a special time of prayer, penitence, restraint and fasting. By so doing, they are refreshed both spiritually and physically. Christians know that well-being and peace of mind are the results of communication with God and that good health is something most people can enjoy. Of course, some illness is unavoidable but our bodies are designed to resist and fight illness. We abuse this gift largely by our eating habits. Fasting, therefore has a great significance during Lent. For at least one short period we give our bodies the chance to rid themselves of the impurities and toxins that accumulate due mainly to our over indulgence in the "good" food so readily available. Fasting does not mean starvation. It is the voluntary abstaining from food or certain kinds of food.

How much refined or pre-prepared foods is your family eating? It is so easy to open a tin or packet of food. The basic ingredients of such foods are good but many labels read -"preservatives added" - "artificial colouring and flavourings added". We rarely stop to think what this implies. Most preservatives destroy some of the food values while most of the artificial colourings and flavouring are chemical based. Thankfully, in Australia, food companies adhere to strict health standards so these effects are minimal. Also, our bodies have a good tolerance



to such additives provided they don't constitute our continual basic diet. This also applies to refined foods for much of the nutrients are destroyed during proceddsing. Unrefined foods are similar in taste and much more beneficial. Processed foods are certainly pleasing to the eye and palate and are convenient and easy to prepare but our bodies deserve foods that do not contain unnecessary additives or have food values destroyed if they are to operate efficiently and effectively.

It takes time and effort to grow our own fruit and vegetables organically and to bake goodies ourselves from ingredients we know but it is well worth the effort. So throughout Lent, at least, why not use some of your time in nurturing your spiritual and physical development.



### IN CASE OF A SNAKE BITE

The following recommended procedure for the treatment of snake bite in Tasmania is an amalgam of the recommendations of the various bodies who are experienced and expert in their respective aspects of the field of treatment of snake bite.

The recommended procedure is as follows. and is applicable to all case of known or suspected snake bites and for all types of Tasmanian snakes.

- 1. For bites on the arm or leg, apply a low pressure constrictive bandage, not less than 1" width, to arrest lymphatic flow from the bite area. Release the constrictive bandage for 30 seconds every & hour. Application of pressure is only of value if applied within two or three hours of the time of bite. Proceed as outlined below. In the very unusual situation of bites other than on a limb, proceed as outlined below.
- 2. Wipe and wash the skin around the bite area. Do not incise the wound.
- 3. Apply mouth to mouth resuscitation if respiratory paralysis is evident.
- 4. Immobilize the limb and keep the patient calm, still and confortable. Stop the patient frommoving about. Transport the patient, in a lying position, quietly to hospital or medical








# ORTS ...

Forthcoming events: Sunday 27th February, St. Helens Game Fishing Club Really Day. Sunday 6th March Scenarior Angling Club surf contest at Writtlers Beach - 2 to 3pm casting -3 to 7m surf fishing.

There have been no centests during the last fortnight and very little news of cabenes in the surf. This usually means that no fish have been cought as most anglers are not backward in advertising their success. On the other hand, game fishermen have reen making almost daily reports of good catches. Last Friday, an angler on "Hiss Behave" hooked a shark estimated at 4001bs but after 15 mins. the fish was able to break a line of 10015 breaking strain. We also have the story of a Scamander Angler, known to his friends as "Father", who tried lising without a hook. After several Albacore had been landed aboard "Miss Believe", the mate commented that one Rish had a hook in its mouth. All agreed that this was unusual and all but "Esther" wound in and checked their goar. On crossing the barwa y, all lines were brought in and "Father" discovered that he had been trailing a Ture but no hook.

Back to the Law on Amateur Fishing -Beach seine nets must be no longer than 50 metres and have a mesh not smaller than 3 centimetres (1.181"). A graball not must be no longer than 50 metres and har a mesh no smaller than 10 centimetres (3.937"). Remember, nevting is prohibited in coastal nivers and lagoons.




