EDITORIAL

WHAT DOES EASTER MEAN TO YOU??

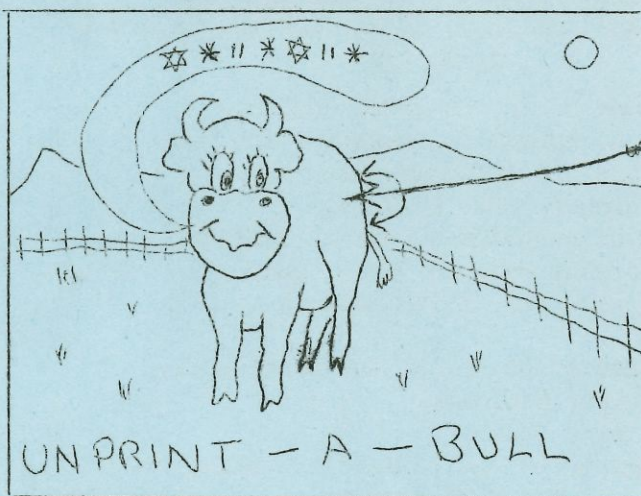
For most people it has become little more than the time of the mythical bunny, empty chocolate eggs, a few days off work, and, tragically, a few added road fatalities. Take away the silver paper, the glitter of commercialism, and what do you have left? Yes, Easter has become like the egg it produces, hollow, empty of real meaning, and in danger of melting in your hands. But read on.

Remember back there in Sunday School when you learnt that Easter was the time 2000 years, when a man called Jesus was nailed to a cross, died and then, to everyone's amazement, rose again three days later. A historical fact, or maybe just a fairytale, you say; either way, what relevance does all that have to me, or to a world torn by hatred, selfishness and bent on its own destruction.

During the three years before his death, Jesus grew to be despised by the leaders of the day. He ministered to people's needs from a heart of deep compassion, healing the sick and feeding the hungry. His love burned like a dazzling light in the darkness exposing the hypocrisy of the leaders around Him, men who placed so much importance on outward forms and rituals, but whose hearts were corrupt and unloving; men who judged others but were blind to their own shortcomings; men who laid heavy laws on the people but ignored the greatest commandment, love.

Jesus saw beyond outward forms to man's heart. He offered a better way - from guilt, a clean heart. He offered healing to the sick, strength to the weak and freedom to the oppressed. He didn't rob others but gave that those around Him might see God's love for them.

The leaders couldn't understand this man who claimed to have the power to forgive sins, who drew men, women and children to himself in love, who spoke words of wisdom that they, in their blindness, couldn't comprehend. Most of all, they despised Him because He called himself the Son of God. So it must have been with a sense of relief that they hung Him on that cross. It was finally over - or was it? Why, it He was so powerful, didn't Jesus get down off that cross.



It was God's intention that Jesus die. There was an enormous gulf between man and God as a result of man's sin. There had to be a sacrifice. Jesus was the perfect sacrifice.

His resurrection was a new beginning. The real message of Easter is a proclamation of life, a promise of hope. At Easter we celebrate the victory of God's love and power over the forces of darkness - hatred, selfishness, and even death itself.

Jesus is still alive today and He continues to offer His world this alternative lifestyle. Hatred and bitterness are natural to man, you say. God never intended that we live this way. This world needs a revolution and a new leader: not in the political sense, but a revolution of love, the sort of love we see manifested in the life of Jesus Christ here on earth. And the new leader, Jesus Himself.

And it starts with us giving our lives to Him that we might be channels for His love to those around us. Easter is significant. It could mean a whole new start for you.

## HERBS WILL HELP YOUR NATURAL BEAUTY

**Tired feet** Nothing is worse than aching feet, they bring aging lines to any face, so help your feet with herbs. Pick elderberry leaves, dry them and crush to a powder, add a little fullers earth to make a powder and dust the feet.

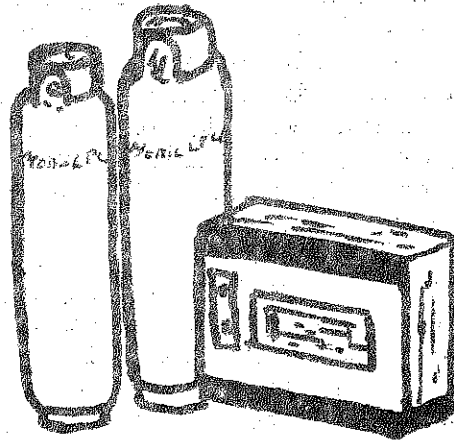
Corns can be helped by using the juice of leeks in a foot bath every day and at night bind the corn up with the skin of the leek. ortie a slice of onion or garlic onto the corn at night, this has great healing powers

A massage oil after the foot bath is a good idea, lemon peel oil is good, after getting the juice out, turn the peel inside out and steeping your favourite oil in the half over night.

Cider vinegar is made from apples and has the malic acid from the apples, which is good both for outside and inside the body, and is also very good for a hair rinse, you can add herbs to make cosmetic vinegars, such as rose petals, lavender, violets, rosemary, bergamot, verben, carnations, or rose geraniums all these herbs are either dried or fresh. Here is a recipe for lavender vinegar, Lavender flowers 6 tablespoons cider vinegar 1 pint, water 1 pint. Add the flowers to the vinegar and steep for two weeks, strain and add the water. Any other flowers can be used, it is as well to use the water, it needs diluting.

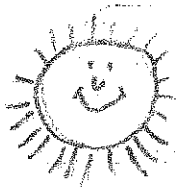

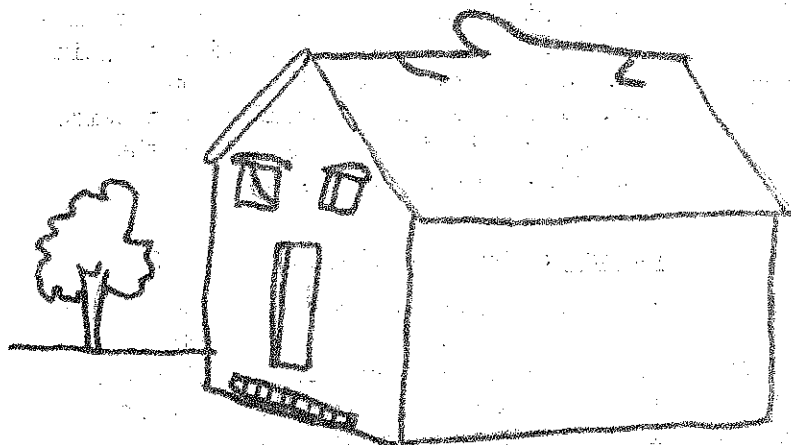

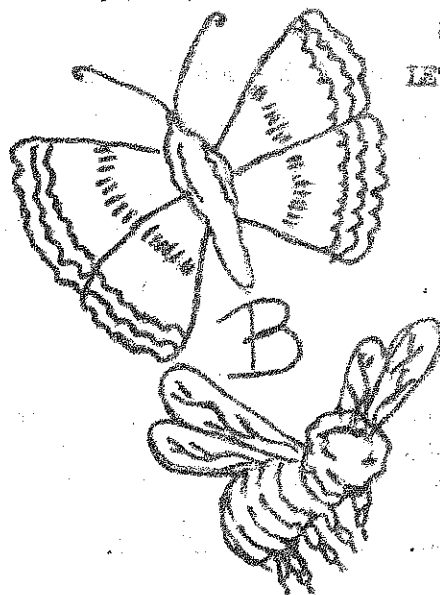
